MINUTES OF THE LITTLE CALUMET RIVER BASIN DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION MEETING HELD ON THURSDAY, DECEMBER 20, 1984 AT 6:30 P.M. IN THE CONFERENCE ROOM OF THE NORTHWESTERN INDIANA REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION, 8149 KENNEDY AVENUE, HIGHLAND, INDIANA.

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by Chairman William Tanke. Nine Commission members were present and a quorum was declared.

The minutes of the November 29, 1984 meeting were approved by Charles Agnew; seconded by Mike Doyne; motion passed unanimously.

Treasurer John DeMeo gave financial report. He announced 2 budget transfers to cover 1984 expenses. John DeMeo made a motion to transfer \$1,000 from Line 312 (NIRPC Services) to Line 119 (Per Diem Expenses) and transfer \$3,500 from Line 312 (NIRPC Services) to Line 311 (Legal Services); Charles Agnew seconded; motion passed unanimously. Motion was made by John DeMeo to approve claim sheet after the Land Acquisition total was changed from \$1,350 to \$1,300; Phil Jaynes seconded; motion passed unanimously.

Dan Gardner announced that the 1985 budget is in the process of being prepared. One item that is holding it up is the Insurance. In the past, the Development Commission's land was covered by an umbrella policy held by the State. After Jan. 12th, we are no longer covered; therefore, the LCRBDC must have its own insurance. Another budget line that has to be increased is Advertising. Advertising cost will increase because of the Marina Prospectus advertising. 1985 budget will be submitted at the January meeting for approval.

Legislative - Phil Jaynes asked that his committee meet after the Development meeting. Dan Gardner distributed the budget request that was sent to Garland Ferrell of the State Budget Agency. He and Martin Behnke met with Legislators Bushemi and Dobis; meeting is being planned with the remaining legislators. Congressman Visclosky will meet with the Development Commission in early January.

A lengthy discussion was held as to whether the Development Commission will still get the State money if the project is not authorized. Emphasis will be put on the river cleaning; not the authorized project.

Breakwater/Marina - Dan Gardner presented final prospectus. Detailed topographic mapping will be included yet before it is mailed out. Clyde Baughard made a motion to accept the Prospectus; Martin Behnke seconded; motion passed unanimously.

Corps of Engineers payment for Phase II of the Breakwater project has not been released yet. A letter from the Corps will be forthcoming which will itemize breakdown of money.

Meeting has been held with NIPSCO and State Highway Dept. in regards to a 4-acre piece of property owned by Bethelem Steel. Dan Gardner recommended the property be appraised for possible acquisition. Clyde Baughard made a motion to have the Land Acq. Committee proceed with obtaining appraisal; Charles Agnew seconded; motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by Clyde Baughard to rent out the nine slips transferred to us by the Porter County Commissioners to Marquette Boat Club at a cost of \$175 per slip; John DeMeo seconded; motion passed unanimously.

Land Acquisition - Charles Agnew announced that Yoko property closed on Dec. 4. He made a motion to offer the appraised price to Norma Ellen Clark for her property; Doyle Niemeyer seconded; motion passed unanimously. He reported that the owner's title policy has been received on Porter County Commissioners lots. Lake County Commissioners lots will be studied to see which ones are in our take area.

Lake Etta - Elaine Chandler of the Lake County Parks Dept. showed a slide presentation on Lake Etta. She announced that Phase II has been approved for Lake Etta. After meeting with the Parks Dept, it was determined that the Development Commission will have to pick up some expenses such as plumbing, furnace repair/replacement, storage facility, etc. Charles Agnew recommended to Finance that a budget line be created for Lake Etta repairs/Capital Improvement Fund for 1985.

Lake County Parks Dept. is willing to transfer ownership of the Tolleston Club properties owned by them to the Development Commission Discussion was held as to whether ownership is necessary at this time. Attorney Lou Casale was instructed to draft up an agreement between the LCRBDC and the Lake County Parks Dept. regarding the disposition of these lots. Concensus was that although the Development Commission does not want ownership at this precise time, ownership title will transfer at no charge when we need it for the Corps project.

Maintenance Project - Dan Gardner announced letter has been received from the State Board of Health stating that the dredged materials taken between Broadway & Chase Street are not considered hazardous material and therefore, pose no environmental problem and does not need a confined disposal site.

In reference to the illegal dredging that has taken place on the Little Calumet River, the Corps has written a letter to the Lake County Drainage Board stating they want the permit to be brought back into compliance and remedial activities corrected. Meeting will be set up between County officials and staff and the Corps officials.

Dan Gardner announced that NIRPC is sponsoring a meeting in which various entities are invited that are interested in procurring a marina. It is a meeting in which possible sites are being discussed for a proposed marina.

Herb Read of the Izaak Walton League offered his assistance to the Development Commission as they will have a lobbyist at the State legislature.

There being no further business, meeting was adjourned. The next LCRBDC meeting was scheduled for January 24.

Dear Mr. Gardner:

Reference is made to the letter from Mr. Louis Casale dated December 10, and various telephone conversations between you, Mr. William Tanke, and Mr. Casale with Mr. Shamel Abou-El-Seoud of our office regarding request for the second and final installment payment for subject project. In the letter and during the telephone conversations the Commission has requested an itemized breakdown of the \$1,095,000 and an explanation of the appropriateness that the Commission cost share in the litigation and monitoring charges.

In regard to monitoring, the Commission will not be required to cost share the monitoring cost. Regarding the litigation charges, the Office of Chief of Engineers reconfirmed their prior instructions that all litigation charges, the Commission's and the Corps' are to be allocated to the project cost and are subject to cost sharing, since the charges were incurred after authorization of the project. The Corps' litigation cost which consists of salaries and travel expenses incurred by our engineers and expert witness from the Waterways Experiment Station is \$9,221.46. The Commission's cost as stated by you is \$4,100. Thus the total litigation cost is \$13,321.46. The Commission's share allocated to the project cost is one half of \$13,321.46, which is equal to \$6.660.73. The balance is \$2,560.73 which is the \$6,660.73 less the \$4,100. That will be rounded off to \$2,500 in the itemized breakdown.

The itemized breakdown for the second and final installment is as follows:

The contingencies cover any unforeseen increases in costs due to construction, supervision & administration and/or engineering and design during construction. Unexpended portion of the contingencies will be refunded to the Commission.

We want to point out that the cost presented in the itemized breakdown is an estimate only. The final costs will be determined after construction of the project is completed and the contract is closed-out. The Corps will then prepare the final cost allocation. If the final cost allocation shows that the Commission has paid more than its share, the excess funds will be refunded to the Commission. If on the other hand the final cost allocation shows that the Commission did not provide its entire share, the Commission will be required to pay the additional sum. The Commission will have access to our records and reports serving the basis for payment determination.

We hope that the above itemized breakdown and explanations meets with your satisfaction. We request that you prepare a check for the amount of \$1,092,500 payable to Finance and Accounting Officer, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, North Central Division and mail to the Chicago District Office, ATTN: Shamel Abou-El-Seoud, NCCED-A by 11 January 1985 instead of 15 December 1984 as requested in our letter of 16 November 1984. Thank you for your cooperation.

Dear Senator Bushemi:

In response to your letter of December 11, 1984, the Indiana Department of Highways (IDCH) would like to realfirm its commitment to replace the concrete box culverts carrying the Little Calumet Riwer under and adjacent to the Borman Expressivey.

As stated in our response to the Borman Task Force, the probable source of funding for the replacement of many of the culverts is interstate Reconstruction "LR" runds. Work eligible for use of Interstate "LR" funding includes pavement restoration rehabilitation, resurfacing and reconstruction work on the Interstate System. The Federal Highway Administration will contribute 90 percent of the total project cost.

Since the necessary hydraulic studies conducted by the army Corps of Engineers will not be completed in the near future, it is not known how soon IDOH will be able to program a culvert replacement project. However, due to the critical flooding problem at the Grant Street interchanges the Army Corps of Engineers will soon complete a study of the situation. The information gathered from that study may be used by IDOH to initiate replacement of that culvert in a more timely manner. According to Mr. Greg Henneke, Hydraulics Engineer in the IDOH Division of Design, the approximate cost for the Grant Street culvert is \$320,000, with a total cost of approximately \$1,200,000 for the entire culvert replacement project.

Re: Little Calumet River Obstruction - Unauthorized

Structures

Please consider this letter a formal request with regards to obstructions lying in the Little Calumet River Drain.

Responsibilities for certain drainage ways within the State are set forth in the Indiana Drainage Code: more particularly, I.C. 36-9-27-1 et.seq. In Lake County, the Lake County Drainage Board is charged with most of these responsibilities, but the responsibilities of other entities are also outlined.

It is common knowledge that during heavy precipitational periods (not limited to Spring & Fall), the Little Calumet River Drain does not function as a contained channel to carry the intense run-off. There are a number of reasons for this condition and past studies have documented them.

In attempting to relieve flooding problems along the Little Calumet River Drain, the Drainage Board has documented conditions that structure openings are inadequate to permit unobstructed flow and should be corrected. Said conditions with respect to the Indiana Department of Highways occur at the following locations: (see the attached map and photos).

- a) I- 80-94 (Borman Expressway)
- b) I 65
- c) Grant Street/on-off ramps to I-80-94 South
- d) Broadway (S.R. 53)

Pursuant to I.C. 36-9-27-71, as well as I.C. 36-9-27-46 and I.C. 36-9-27-47, copies of which are enclosed, this letter is to inform you of these obstructing structures, and to request that you remove and replace said structures with structures providing adequate opennings to allow proper and free flow of the drain.

The requirements for these structures, should by submitted to the Army Corps of Engineers, the Indiana Department of Natural Resources, the Lake County Drainage Board, and other agencies having jurisdiction, for approval.




