The meeting was called to order at 6:35 p.m. by Chairman Michael Doyne. Eight Commissioners were present. Guests were recognized and quorum was declared.

Clyde Baughard made a motion to approve the minutes of the July 30th meeting as presented; George Carlson seconded the motion; motion passed unanimously.

Finance/Policy Committee - Treasurer Doyle Niemeyer presented the current financial status report for August. Mr. Niemeyer made a motion to approve the August claims as presented; Clyde Baughard seconded; motion passed unanimously. He reported that the policy has been received on land liability insurance.

Legislative Committee - Dan Gardner stated he has been in contact with the staff of Congressman Visclosky's office. They have reported that nothing has yet been received from Washington Chief's Office of the Corps officially stating their position. He has talked to Richard Carlson, Chief of Planning for the Chicago Corps, who is also concerned that Washington has not yet officially directed them to work on the 3A plan. Mr. Gardner will be contacting the Senators' office and request assistance from their office in pushing the Corps to make a statement. Clyde Baughard made a motion directing staff to contact the Senators' Office and enlist their aid; seconded by Charles Agnew; motion passed unanimously.

Eleven response letters have been received from property owners in the Small Farms area in regard to possible relocation. Dave Hunter of the Corps and Dan Gardner re-visited the homeowners in an attempt to contact those people who were not at home the first time they visited. As of now, no negative responses have been received.

Land Acquisition/Management Committee - Committee Chairman Chuck Agnew gave the land acquisition report. He reported that a letter from the County Commissioners' Office was received declaring the transferral of 25 tax sale lots to the Development Commission that were requested. He proceeded to report that the north line property at Lake Etta has all been cleared and fencing is ready to be started.

Mr. Agnew made a motion to accept Tom Bochnowski's appraisal of the slips on Burns Waterway that are on Commission property; seconded by Clyde Baughard; motion passed unanimously. Mr. Agnew also made a motion that staff be authorized to secure a lease at the appraised value or initiate litigation to remove the docks from Commission property for the 1987 boating season; seconded by Clyde Baughard; motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Agnew announced that the bids for the farm land advertised is scheduled for 3:00 p.m. September 8, 1987.

Interium Flood Control Planning Committee - In Committee Chairman Arlene Colvin's absence, Dan Gardner gave the committee report. He reported that bridge replacement over the river at U.S. 41 and culvert replacement at I-80 on Grant Street have been added to the 1986-1988 Indiana Department of Highways Biennial Highway Improvement Program. Tentative construction of these two items is slated for 1988 for Grant St. and 1993 for U.S. 41 bridge.

Frank DeRisi, Lake County Highway Dept., informed staff that Boyd Construction will remove the culverts at Taft Street. A field inspection of those culverts is taking place now to determine cost.

The city of Gary contracted with a private contractor to clean out the culverts at Chase Street. The culverts are now all clean and water is flowing at full capacity.

Mr. Gardner reported that the study done by Ten Ech for the Basin Commission on the Penn Central culvert replacement is complete. It contends that benefits would be obtained by replacing those culverts. Lake County Drainage Board is now in process of seeking a permit from the Corps. Estimate of cost for replacement is approximately \$120,000.

Ten Ech Engineering has provided rough cost estimates for modification at Erie R.R. bridge regarding removal of 2 or 3 piers. There is debris accumulated under that bridge; George Carlson offered to notify the Hammond Public Works Dept. about their commitment to clean under bridge.

Breakwaters/Marina Committee - Committee Chairman Bill Tanke referred to a letter contained in the packet to Lt. Col. Jess Franco once again emphasizing the urgent need for breakwater contract closure.

The attorney will review the contract with the Corps to see where the Commission's obligation lies in case of any accident at the breakwaters. Mr. Tanke would like something in writing from the Coast Guard stating their responsibility for the lighting.

The inspection of the breakwaters with the Corps has been cancelled due to inclement weather - it has been rescheduled for 10:30 on August 26th.

Mr. Tanke made a motion for staff to write a letter to the Corps after the field inspection giving them 10 days to answer what the status is regarding the breakwater contract closure - if we do not hear from them within the 10 day period, the Commission will refer the matter to the Congressional people for action; motion seconded by John DeMeo; motion passed unanimously.

The next meeting was scheduled for 6:30 p.m. Thursday, October 1, 1987. There being no further business, the meeting adjourned 7:15 p.m.

INTERIM FLOOD COMMITTEE TOPICS

- Lake County Drainage Board contractor, Wolf Construction Company, has completed clearing and snagging project from Indianapolis Blvd. bridge eastward to Kennedy Avenue bridge.
  - \$35,000 of work completed
- Lake County Drainage Board has committed its earmarked \$50,000 for the Little Calumet River for a sediment excavation project in the area just snagged - Indianapolis Blvd. bridge area eastward to Kennedy Ave. bridge.
  - Plans and specs being prepared
- Taft Street culverts will be removed this week or early next week by contractor Don Ewen. Machinery breakdown has caused delay.
- Basin Commission/staff has established remaining local responsibility river maintenance projects (those you have listed on the blue sheets contained in your agenda packet); met with and sent letter to Steve Manich, Lake County surveyor (letter is available); letter was presented to Lake County Drainage Board for consideration/concurrence.
- Clearing of debris under the Erie R.R. bridge has been accomplished. Since debris will accumulate again, consideration may want to be given to having 2 or 3 of the piers removed. (George Carlson may want to speak to this issue).
- Penn Central R.R. permit application by the Lake County Drainage Board is ongoing. (Dan has a letter he will read from Ten Ech)

SUBJECT: Little Calumet River, Indiana Project

STATUS: \* Work on authorized plan (3A) initiated in September.

- \* Completed the detailed hydraulic design on the authorized plan - control structure at Hart Ditch is needed
- \* Design of Hart Ditch control structure 70% completed - structure is an ungated constriction.
- \* Interior drainage analysis and design of new pump stations in east reach levee system 60% completed.
- \* Design of landscaping plan being done by A/E firm. Work 20% completed.

ISSUES: \* Will begin negotiations on draft LCA this month.

- \* Need data on existing pumping stations to determine if rehabilitation of critical features is required. Possible savings to owners if advanced maintenance work is found to be justified. Will need assistance from Commission to obtain data.
- \* Selection of spoil disposal sites will require assistance from Commission and local communities.
- \* Have received commitments from 60% of the 23 property owners in Black Oak on relocation. Only 1 firm negative response to date.

PROBLEM AREA: The intent of the Administration is to look at both the authorized and National Economic Development Plan and determine the best alternative.

FUNDING: The FY88 budget request has sufficient funds to complete the Phase II GDM and initiate work on the first Feature Design Memorandum.

KEY EVENTS: MAR 88 - Coordinate draft Phase II GDM  
APR 88 - Submit Phase II GDM for agency review  
DEC 89 - Approval of 1st Plans & Specs  
JUL 90 - Initiate construction

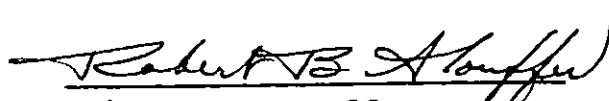

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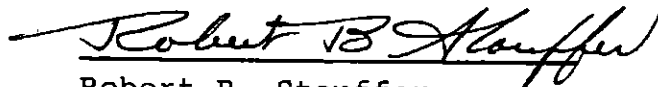

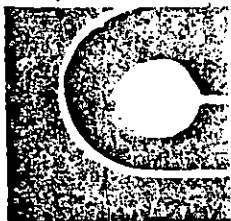

Dear Jeff:

The Little Calumet River Basin Development Commission is writing to enlist the aid of Senator Lugar along with Senator Quayle and Congressman Visclosky to confirm from Assistant Secretary of the Army John Doyle the Corps of Engineers commitment to construct the Little Calumet River Flood Control/Recreation project as described by language contained in the Water Resources Development Act of 1986. Although this bill was passed by Congress and signed into law by President Reagan with specific directive language for construction and subsequent Congressional appropriations are proceeding to fund this described plan, the Washington level Corps officials have indicated a reluctance to direct the Chicago District to implement the plan as directed in the law.

The Development Commission firmly believes the plan as described in H.R. 6 is the only comprehensive solution to fairly and assuredly solve the region's flooding problems, and this was reflected in the unanimous support for this plan. The hard work of the Senators, Congressman and all area officials will be negated if the Corps of Engineers fails to implement the project as directed in the law. Delay to cause implementation can only lead to increased costs, a major concern expressed by Corps officials.

## Plan widens for Little Cal flood control

The Army Corps of Engineers will proceed with planning on a more expensive and extensive version of flood control for the Little Calumet River in Gary.

But while local officials who favor the plan hail the decision as a step in the right direction, corps officials caution they are not committed to the construction of levees called for in the plan.

The more extensive plan, known as Plan 3A, was approved by Congress last year and carries an \$871 million price tag, said Evelyn Schuele, a representative of the corps.

Plan 3B, favored by corps officials in Washington, D.C., would cost an estimated \$44.4 million, but would not include most of 10 miles of levees in Gary to protect the Black Oak community from flooding.

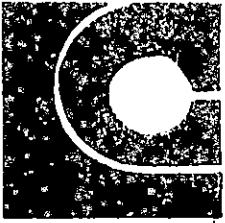
John S. Doyle, the corps' civilian director, in a letter Tuesday, directed staff to proceed with planning of both versions. Construction of a flood-control project is expected to start late in 1989 or early in 1990, and a decision on which plan will be used is expected next summer.

David Hunter, the study manager for the project for the corps, said staff will be making functional designs of each component of the plans. He said those designs will be considered next year when making a final decision on which plan to use.

"The letter does not make a final commitment," said Hunter. "There is still a question as to which plan the secretary will finally endorse."

Michael Doyne, the chairman of the Little Calumet River Basin Development Commission, and U.S. Sen. Richard Lugar, R-Ind., praised the corps' decision.

"This is really a nice breakthrough for the project," said Doyne. "I would think there is more likelihood for going ahead with 3A. I think it's a step in the right direction. This is better than what we had before. It was total limbo before."

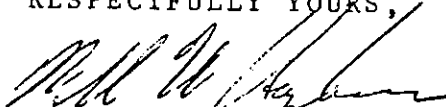

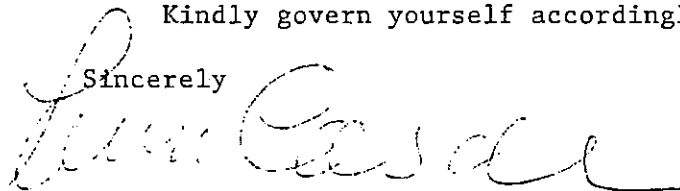

I am writing in response to your letter of 13 August 1987, to bring you up to date on the current status of the Burns Waterway Small Boat Harbor Project. All construction activities have been completed and the project was considered substantially complete on 19 May 1987. Miscellaneous punch-list items were completed on 8 July 1987.

The contractor has submitted several claims which have been negotiated and modifications to the contract were issued based on these negotiations. The contractor has not signed these final modifications to date and has requested a meeting with me. I will meet with the contractor in the near future and hope to settle all remaining issues, however, I cannot do the final accounting on the project, as you have requested, until the contract is closed out and all contract claims and appeals have been resolved.

I am hopeful that these claims will be settled soon, however, it is the contractor's right under the terms of the contract to pursue an appeal process on claims which he believes have merit. In the event the claims are determined to be meritorious, costs associated with these claims are project costs and must be cost-shared in accordance with the local cooperation agreement.

# A Success Story

## Hobart man nominated for teacher of the year

**HOBART TWP.** — Charles Agnew's time is devoted not only to his family — including his "classroom kids" — but to his community.

Maybe that's why he's been nominated Indiana Teacher of the Year. The Hobart Township school system approved his nomination last week. The selection will be made by the Indiana Department of Education later this year.

Agnew's been tapped for the nomination as much for his community involvement as for his classroom work.

Eleven years ago, Agnew and his wife, Joyceann, grew concerned over the plight of orphaned children in Korea.

The Angews had two sons at the time, Charles II and David. But they'd always hoped for a daughter as well. They realized that wish when they adopted Jody, a 9-month-old Korean baby. She's now a sixth grader at River Forest School.

Caught up with the medical problems of children all over the world, Agnew applied for a license in the Heal the Children program.

Through that affiliation, the Agnews have accepted into their homes children who are either awaiting surgery or recovering from operations. They've had three such children live with them.

They most recently cared for Sara, a nine-month old, who was treated here for pneumonia. But since her family lives near enough for medical help, the baby has since been returned to a migrant labor camp in the Baja area of Mexico.

"This one is very hard to let go," Agnew said.

He's got a soft heart for local kids as well. He has served on the New Chicago Park Board since 1968, when the board was first organized. There wasn't a single park within the town.

In spite of very limited park board budgets through the years, the town now boasts Twin Oaks Park, built on a former garbage dump; Centennial Park, a 1976 centennial project federally funded; and Peter-Wallace Neighborhood Park, named for the two New Chicago residents who lost their lives in Vietnam.

For the past 15 years, Agnew also had

worked toward improving the Little Calumet River basin. He was on that commission from 1972 to 1980, when the governor appointed him to the Little Calumet River Basin Development Commission.

Along with all these activities, Agnew has remained a popular sixth grade teacher at River Forest School. His teaching philosophy is one of involvement.

For example, two students received partial scholarships to attend the Indiana University-Bloomington Gifted and Talented summer program. Neither had the \$200 that participants had to put up for the program. So Agnew approached fellow teachers, principal and administrators.

Everybody helped draft a list of chores, for which the students were paid. They were able to earn the necessary money.

"I favor partial scholarships. They (students) shouldn't get it all free," he said. "If they work for something, it means a little bit more to them."

The Hobart Township administration says Agnew's the kind of teacher who keeps track of his classroom kids. He takes pride in their success. And they know he's there if they need him.
