MINUTES OF THE LITTLE CALUMET RIVER BASIN DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION HELD AT 6:30 P.M. WEDNESDAY, JULY 1, 1992 AT THE COMMISSION OFFICES 8149 KENNEDY AVENUE, HIGHLAND, INDIANA

Chairperson Arlene Colvin Called the meeting to order at 6:35 p.m. Seven (7) Commissioners were present. Quorum was declared and guests were recognized.

The minutes of the June 2nd, 1992 meeting were approved by a motion from Clyde Baughard; seconded by Chuck Agnew; motion passed unanimously.

Executive Director's Report - Mr. Gardner gave an update to the Commission regarding Wicker Park Manor levee project. He stated he had attended a technical coordinating meeting between agencies and referred to a map of the area. Two basic items came out of the meeting: (1) Existing sheet wall may need to be strengthed to meet federal standards. It will be tied back to high land; (2) north line being looked to for Corps for federal construction. It is not a 3 month project. Corps says spring letting, summer completion in 1993. Bridge raising needs to be coordinated at the same time. If Corps does the construction, the \$700,000 will be a federal cost. The new levee line is further north; that means property owners will gain useful property - not lose it.

Finance/Policy Committee - Committee Chairman Clyde Baughard presented the financial status report for June as well as the claims. Mr. Baughard made a motion to approve the pending claims; motion seconded by Charles Agnew; motion passed unanimously.

Legislative Committee - Mr. Gardner reported and referred to newspaper articles regarding the \$11 million approved by the House Appropriations Committee for the flood control project. \$150,000 was also approved for the Burns Harbor Waterway small boat harbor. These monies would be used for assessing dredging need of the mouth of Burns Waterway near breakwater. Securing this money is good news because it shows that the Corps is satisfied with our progress in the pursuit of the public marina.

The Federal schedule revision has not been received yet. We hope to receive it in the near future. Because of some utility concern and the issue of Grant Street bridge raising alteration, delay will be incurred.

Mr. Gardner also announced that the new colonel arrives tomorrow. His name is Lt. Col. David Reed and he will replace Lt. Col. Inouye. The Commission will be represented at the ceremony.

Land Acquisition Committee - Land Acquisition Chairman Chuck Agnew reported that DC301 has closed this month. Mr. Agnew stated the committee had met with Lake County Park Board committee on June 17 to discuss land issues. We presented the park committee with detailed areas of lots needed for Stage III levee construction. It will be acted upon at the next Park Board meeting.

Project Engineering/Construction Committee - Mr. Gardner reported the bid opening date of Stage II Phase II construction has been pushed back to July 21. He also reported that a meeting was held with Hammond, Highland and Munster regarding the west reach levee construction. The concept behind the meeting was for reaction now to the plans of road closures and not later to identify problems after plans and specs are completed.

Jim Flora from R.W. Armstrong reported on utility meeting held recently involving the west reach. Discussion took place on type of closure structures. Corps received input from other public utilities attending the meeting. Relative to the east reach utilities, the utility companies are in the process of putting together plans. Some utilities need field relocation identified.

Mr. Flora, RWArmstrong, stated he met with specific utilities today. It is imperative that utilities be protected throughout the construction phases. Utilities must start making plans for construction modifications now.

We have received a letter from NIPSCO relative to cost reimbursement associated with relocation of utilities. Letter will need to be addressed in the near future. Discussion ensued as to NIPSCO pipelines on public right-of-way. Some utilities have acquired their own easement rights.

Lake County Emergency Management will coordinate the flood warning system.

Mr. Gardner reported that the first segment is nearing completion. An engineering inspection by R.W. Armstrong will be coordinated with the Corps before final approval is given.

Marina/Breakwater Committee - Committee Chairman Bill Tanke asked Chuck Eckenstahler of Abonmarche to bring the Commission up to date on the marina status. Mr. Eckenstahler displayed the gantt chart showing the tracking of performed items in their contract. Abonmarche has kept on schedule on all marina related activities assigned to them. Mr. Tanke made a motion to accept the final report from Abonmarche; Chuck Agnew seconded the motion; motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Gardner stated that the City of Portage has sent out a RFP for selection of an engineer as the next step. RFP's are due tomorrow. After proposals are received, a marina committee meeting will be held to allow for review of the proposals.

Discussion ensued on whether certain utility lines were dead or alive that crossed the marina property. NIPSCO will be contacted to determine the facts.

Crisman Road vacation has been filed with the city.

There was no other business. The next Commission meeting was scheduled for Thursday, August 6, 1992 at 6:30.

PROPOSED MUNICIPAL MARINA ADJACENT TO THE BURNS WATERWAY AT PORTAGE, INDIANA

In Reply Refer to:

- 1. The Little Calumet River Basin Development Commission, 8149 Kennedy Avenue, Highland, Indiana, 46322, has applied to this office for a Federal permit to be considered under authority of Section 10 of the River and Harbor Act of 1899 and Section 404 of the Clean Water Act of 1977 to construct a municipal marina facility adjacent to the Burns Waterway near the junction of SR 249 and U.S. 12 in the City of Portage, Porter County, Indiana (T37N, R7W, Section 36).
- 2. As shown on the attached plan(s), the applicant proposes to construct a marina basin with 254 slips and a 3 boat launch lane facility, construct a public boardwalk and fishing pier, and remove 19 existing piers from the waterway. The project would be performed in fulfillment of an obligation with a Federal Section 107 breakwater/small boat harbor project between the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Chicago District and the Little Calumet River Basin Development Commission (a copy of the agreement is available from the Commission). The following are major construction elements within the project:
- a. Excavation--Excavate approximately 400,000 cubic yards of sand material (currently being performed as part of a sand mining operation not requiring Corps authorization) to a depth of 6' below the low water datum (571.5' I.G.L.D.. 1985). Corps authorization is required for the removal of an earthen plug between the basin and the waterway which would remain until basin excavation is complete.
- b. Dredging--Remove approximately 750 cubic yards of material from the waterway to create an access channel (proposed bottom elevation-572 I.G.L.D. 1985). All dredged material would be disposed upland with no return to the waterway or any wetland area. Dredging would be performed in compliance with the terms and conditions in the Environmental Assessment of the Burns Waterway system prepared by HNTB, dated December 1991. Corps authorization is required for all dredging activities.

- c. Maintenance Dredging--The applicant is requesting a 10 year maintenance dredging permit to remove approximately 500 cubic yards of material from the marina basin and access channel every 2 to 4 years. All material would be disposed upland with no return to the waterway or any wetland area. Corps authorization is required for maintenance dredging activities.
- d. Internal basin--Construct approximately 2,300 lineal feet of concrete or steel sheet piling retaining walls, construct 10 main runway piers and 115 finger piers. The basin would also be connected to the waterway by a circulation tube. Corps authorization is required for all piers, retaining walls and the circulation tube.
- e. Handicap-access fishing boardwalk--Construct a 1,200' boardwalk ranging from 5' to 15' in width along the Burns Waterway (approximately 12,000 sq ft of deck supported by approximately 240 wood or steel piling) Corps authorization is required for the boardwalk.
- f. Boat Launch--Place precast or cast in place concrete panels and two 5' x 50' piers within the marina basin. Corps authorization is required for the boat launch.
- g. Shore Protection--Place approximately 3300 cubic yards of toe stone and armor/mattress stone over filter cloth. Corps authorization is required for the shore protection.
 - h. Remove 19 slips (existing) from the waterway.
- 3. Water quality certification (or waiver thereof) is required from the State of Indiana, Department of Environmental Management.
- 4. The applicant has either received or requested the following governmental authorization:
- 5. This notice is being published in compliance with Title 33 Code of Federal Regulation Parts 320-330. Any interested parties and agencies desiring to express their views concerning the proposed work may do so by written comment to the Chief, Construction-Operations Division, Detroit District Corps of Engineers, Box 1027, Detroit, Michigan 48231, postmarked or delivered in person no later than the expiration date of this public notice. Comments of a positive or negative nature may be submitted. A lack of response will be interpreted as meaning that there is no objection to the permit application.

- 6. Any person may request, in writing, within the comment period specified in this notice, that a public hearing be held to consider this application. Request for public hearings shall state, with particularity, the reasons for holding a public hearing.
- The decision whether to issue a permit will be based on an evaluation of the probable impact of the proposed activity on the public interest. That decision will reflect the national concern for both protection and utilization of important resources. benefit which reasonably may be expected to accrue from the proposal must be balanced against its reasonably foreseeable detriments. All factors which may be relevant to the proposal will be considered including the cumulative effects thereof; among those are conservation, economics, aesthetics, general environmental concerns, wetlands, historic properties, fish and wildlife values, flood hazards, floodplain values, land use, navigation, shoreline erosion and accretion, recreation, water supply and conservation, water quality, energy needs, safety, food and fiber production, mineral needs, considerations of property ownership, and, in general, the needs and welfare of the people.
- 8. This application will be reviewed for the potential impact on threatened or endangered species pursuant to Section 7 of the Endangered Species Act as amended. If it is determined that the proposed activity may jeopardize the continued existence of listed species or destroy or adversely modify their critical habitat, formal consultation procedures will be initiated with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service or National Marine Fisheries Service.
- 9. This activity involves the discharge of dredged or fill material into waters of the United States. Therefore, the evaluation of the impact of the activity on the public interest will include application of the guidelines promulgated by the Administrator, EPA, under the authority of Section 404(b)(1) of the Clean Water Act.
- 10. The District Staff has reviewed existing information on historic properties potentially affected by the proposed project, including the National Register of Historic Places. No listed places are located within the proposed permit area. Through coordination with the State Historic Preservation Officer, the likelihood that unidentified historic properties or cultural deposits exist within the proposed permit area will be evaluated, the potential for impacts to these resources will be assessed, and any necessary avoidance measures will be incorporated prior to a decision on the application.

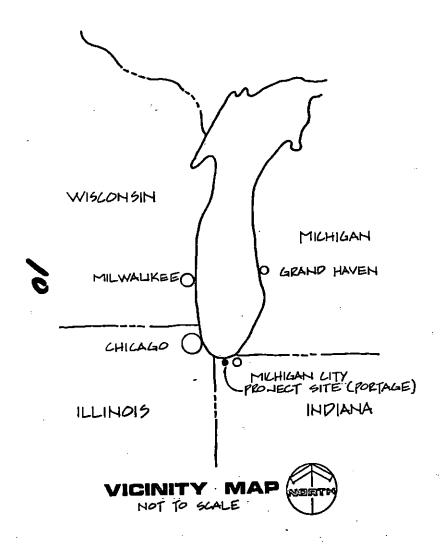
- 11. The Corps of Engineers is soliciting comments from the public; Federal, State, and local agencies and officials; Indian Tribes; and other interested parties in order to consider and evaluate the impacts of this proposed activity. Any comments received will be considered by the Corps of Engineers to determine whether to issue, modify, condition or deny a permit for this proposal. To make this decision, comments are used to assess impacts on endangered species, historic properties, water quality, general environmental effects, and the other public interest factors listed above. Comments are used in the preparation of an Environmental Assessment and/or an Environmental Impact Statement pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act. Comments are also used to determine the need for a public hearing and to determine the overall public interest of the proposed activity.

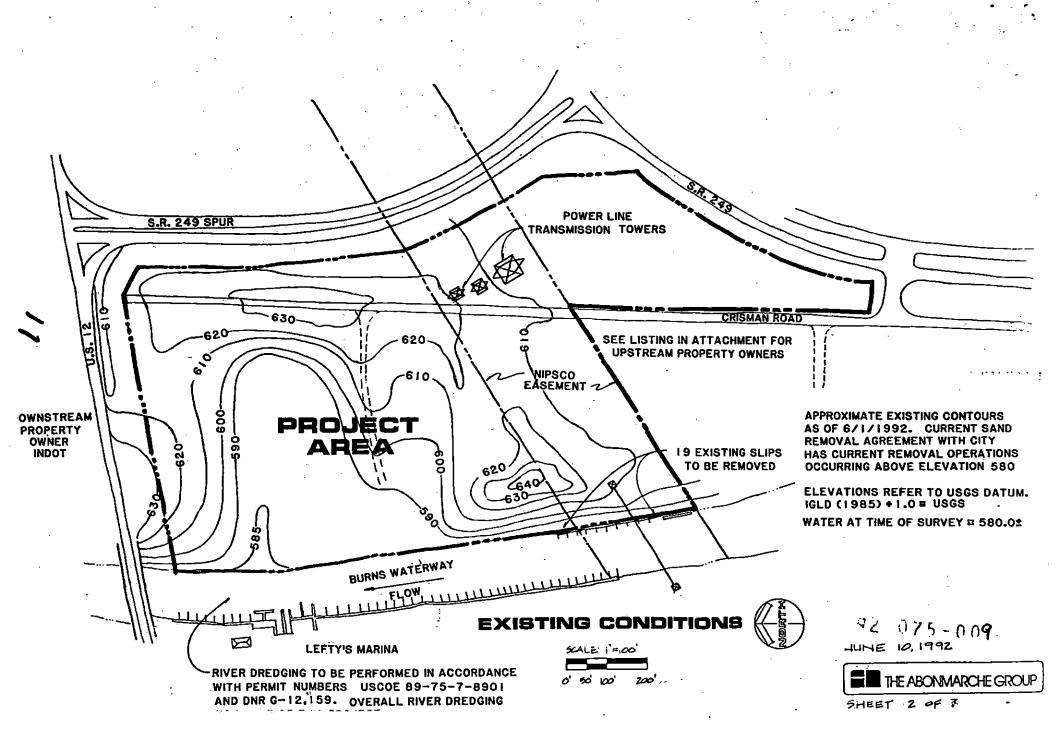


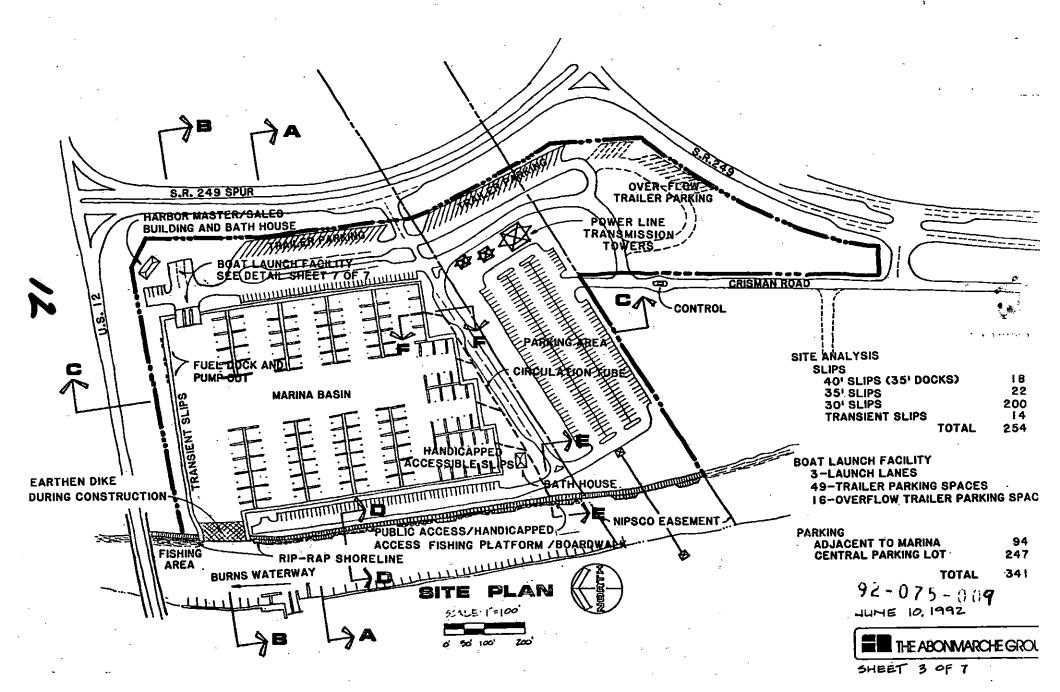
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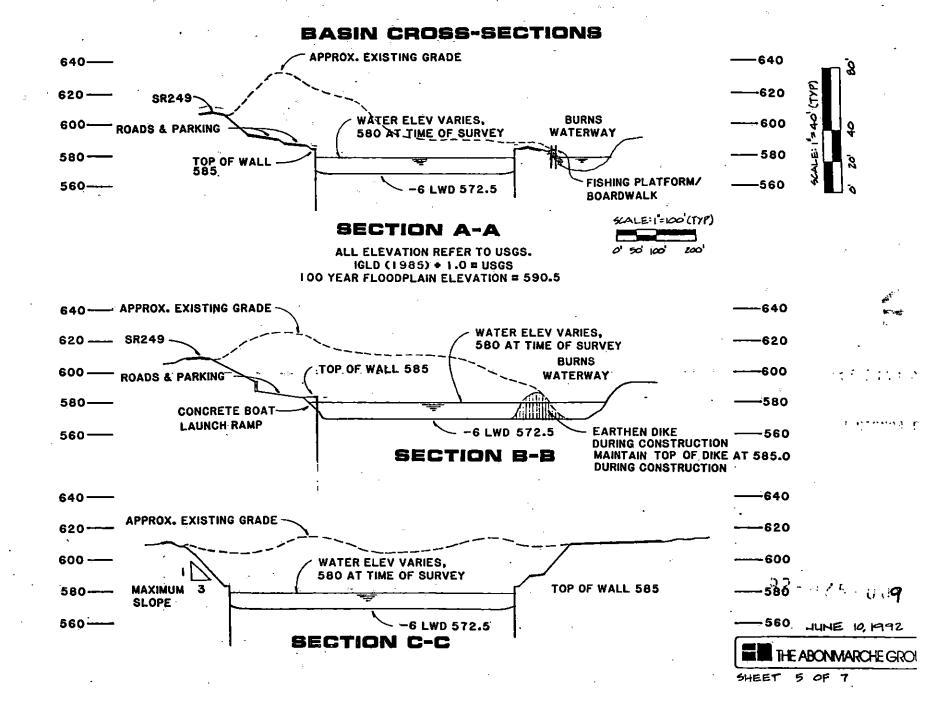
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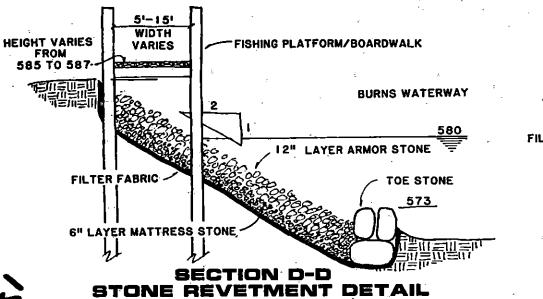


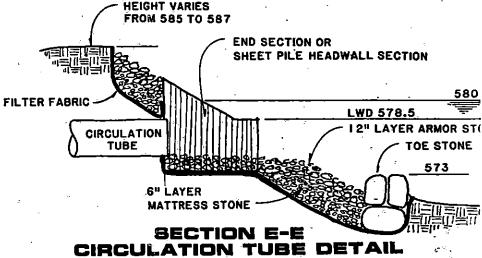




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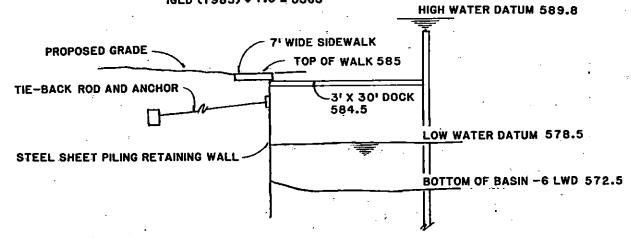




NOT TO SCALE

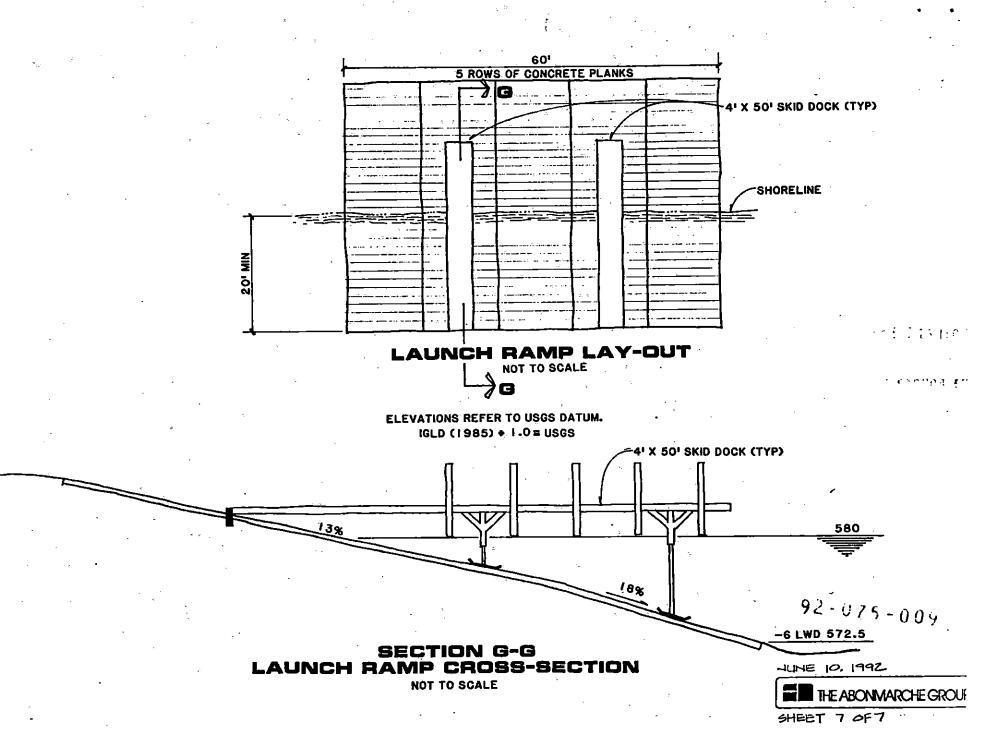

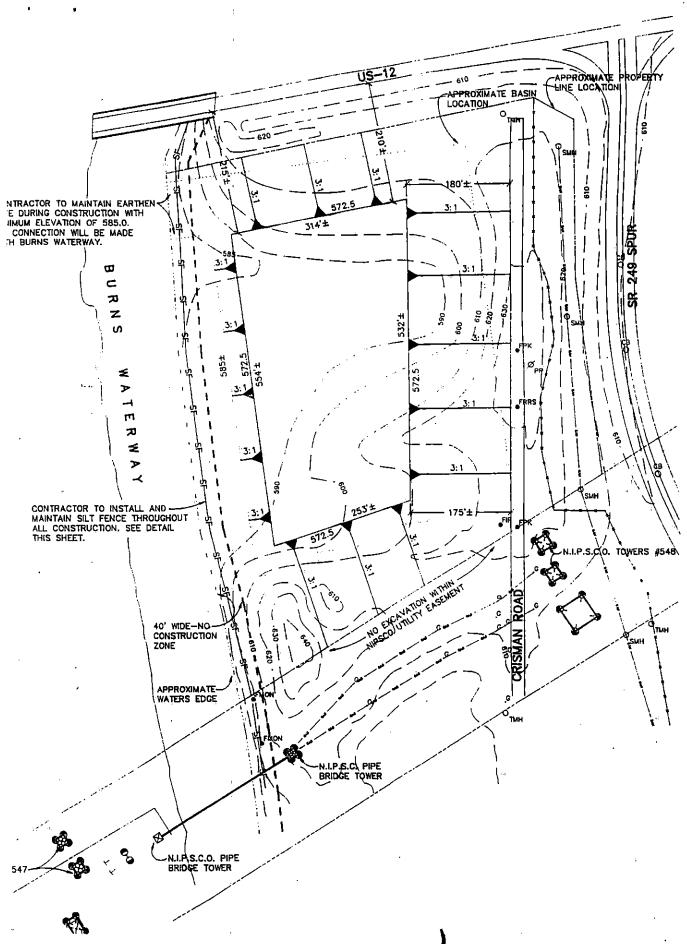

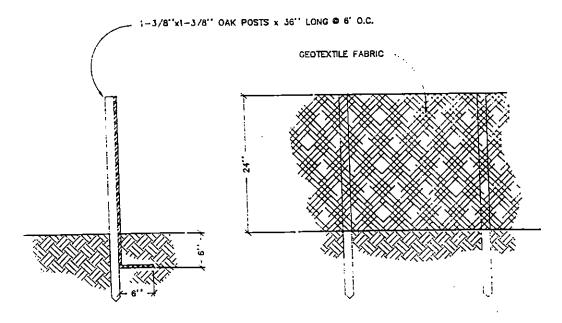




PROPOSED GRADING PLAN

GENERAL NOTES:

- THROUGHOUT CONSTRUCTION, CONTRACTOR SHALL INSTALL AND MAINTAIN A SILT FENCE, AS SHOWN ON DETAIL A.
- 2. CONTRACTOR SHALL MAINTAIN AN EARTHEN DIKE DURING CONSTRUCTION, WITH A MINIMUM ELEVATION OF 585.0. NO CONNECTION SHALL BE MADE BETWEEN BURNS WATERWAY AND BELOW GROUNDWATER EXCAVATION, UNLESS APPROVED BY THE CITY OF PORTAGE AND AFTER THE CONTRACTOR HAS OBTAINED ALL NECESSARY STATE, AND FEDERAL PERMITS.
- 3. CONTRACTOR SHALL PROTECT ALL EXISTING UNDERGROUND AND ABOVEGROUND UTILITIES DURING CONSTRUCTION. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL PERFORM ALL EXCAVATION AT A PROPER DISTANCE FROM ALL EXISTING UTILITIES TO PREVENT THE NEED OF SPECIAL SHEETING, SHORING, OR BRACING. IN THE EVENT SPECIAL, SHEETING, SHORING, OR BRACING IS REQUIRED, THE CONTRACTOR SHALL PROVIDE PRIOR NOTIFICATION TO THE LCRBDC OF SUCH REQUIREMENT AND SHALL DEMONSTRATE THE NEED OF SUCH A REQUIREMENT AND RECEIVE WRITTEN APPROVAL PRIOR TO INCURRING ANY COSTS FOR SUCH SHEETING, SHORING, OR BRACING.
- 4. THROUGHOUT CONSTRUCTION, CONTRACTOR SHALL INSTALL AND MAINTAIN SNOW FENCE OR OTHER ACCEPTABLE MEANS AS REQUIRED TO ELIMINATE OFF-SITE SAND BLOWING.
- ALL EXCAVATED MATERIAL SHALL BE REMOVED FROM THE SITE AND SHALL BE TRANSPORTED TO AN UPLAND SITE, AS DETERMINED BY THE CONTRACTOR.
- 6. CONTRACTOR SHALL INSTALL TEMPORARY AND PERMANENT VEGETATION IN A MANNER ACCEPTABLE TO THE CITY OF PORTAGE IN LOCATIONS AND TIMING AS DIRECTED BY THE SOIL EROSION OFFICER.
- 7. NO DREDGING OR EXCAVATION SHALL BE PERFORMED WITHIN THE BURNS WATERWAY OR THE 40-FOOT WIDE NO CONSTRUCTION ZONE.

Senate OKs cash for Little Cal

INDIANAPOLIS (AP) - The Little Calumet Flood Control Project would receive \$11 million in funding and an additional \$2.5 million would be spent on flood control projects in Indianapolis, Evansville and Fort Wayne under legislation approved by the Senate, lawmakers said Tuesday.

The Senate on Monday approved an energy and water appropriations bill to fund projects during the financial year that begins Oct. 1. The House already has a passed a similar bill.

The measures now head to conference committee to resolve

differences.

The Senate bill included \$11 million to continue construction of the \$92 million Little Calculate project, designed to curb some of the \$12 million in average annual flooding damage along the banks of the river in Lake County, said Rep. Pete Visclosky, D.Ind.

The Senate bill also include \$1.5 million for flood control studies on the White River in Indianapolis, \$800,000 for flood control in Evansville and \$240,000 for flood control planning in Fort Wayne, said Sen. Dan Coats, R-Ind.

The Senate has approved a 1993 water projects bill that eliminates the Lake George dredging project in Hobart but protects most other Northwest Indiana projects previously approved by the House.

1. U.S. Rep. Peter J. Visclosky, D-Merrillville, said Tuesday the Senate on Monday approved an Energy and Water Appropriations bill for fiscal year 1993 that cats financing for two projects for which he had secured approval in the House version of the bill.

Visclosky said the Senate eliminated \$260,000 for the planning and engineering work on the removal of the sediment that has choked Lake George for years.

The Senate bill also reduced the financing for the Cady Marsh Ditch flood control project in Griffith and Highland from \$400,000 to \$170,000.

"I will do all I can to restore funding when the House and Senate versions of the bill are reconciled," Visclosky said.

Jeff O'Mara, Visclosky's press secretary, said the fiscal bills must be settled by Oct. 1.

Visclosky, however, said he is pleased that the bulk of the \$13.275 million for water projects for Lake and

Porter counties was left intact by the Senate.

Most of the money — \$11 million — is for the Army Corps of Engineers to continue work on the \$92.3 million Little Calumet River flood control and recreation project.

The other financing includes:

\$1.016 million for the Burns Waterway harbor to replace breakwall stone and dredge the harbor.

\$401,000 for the design of a disposal site for the Indiana Harbor confined disposal facility.

■ \$150,000 for the Burns Waterway small boat harbor development.

■ \$40,000 for monitoring the embankment work at Beverly Shores.
