

MINUTES OF THE LITTLE CALUMET RIVER BASIN DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION HELD AT 6:30 P.M. THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 5, 1996 AT THE HIGHLAND TOWN HALL 3333 RIDGE ROAD HIGHLAND, INDIANA

Chairman William Tanke called the meeting to order at 6:40 p.m. Nine (9) Commissioners were present. Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Quorum was declared and guests were recognized.

The minutes of the August 6, 1996 meeting were approved by a motion from Robert Trelo; motion seconded by Chuck Agnew; motion passed unanimously.

Executive Director's Report - Mr. Gardner informed the Board that staff is continuing to work with Gary to obtain necessary lands needed for the project area. R. W. Armstrong is currently doing an engineering alternatives analysis for the east reach remediation area at I65-I/80-94. The Mayor had requested an extension of time before we proceeded with any acquisition in that area. We need to move on in order to obtain an IDNR permit before any further construction can happen.

LCRBDC Minutes September 5, 1996 Page 2

Mr. Gardner stated that the comments that IDNR and R.W.Armstrong put together regarding the Operations & Maintenance Manual (O&M) were sent to the COE. We stressed the need for a management summary with overall cost levels and basic operational points that we can actually work with in an emergency situation.

Land Acquisition Committee - Committee Chairman Chuck Agnew reported there were no increased offers this month or no condemnations. He then proceeded to make a motion to authorize a demolition contract with Congress Enterprises for a bid amount of \$14,000; motion seconded by John DeMeo; motion passed unanimously.

<u>Project Engineering Committee</u> - Committee Chairman Bob Huffman gave the engineering report. He reported that in regard to the bids received for the greenhouse - there were 2 bids received; both bids far exceeded engineering cost estimate and were too high for available monies. Mr. Huffman made a motion to reject both bids, go back and revise the plans & specs and then rebid; motion seconded by Emerson Delaney; motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Huffman made a motion to approve payment of \$9,950 for engineering services provided by Northwest Engineering Company for modifications for the pump station at Burr Street (these modifications were made to accommodate the COE); motion seconded by Emerson Delaney; motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Huffman proceeded to inform the Board of engineering meetings that have taken place this last month. There was a meeting on 8/6 with IDNR and a Griffith developer to review the levee between Cline & EJ&E (soil borings need to be taken to see if the clay will meet federal standards); staff attended the Gary Common Council to review street vacates (approval temporarily on hold); a field meeting was held on 8/21 for the betterment levee.

Commissioner Nathaniel Leonard inquired about the relocation of the greenhouse. Mr. Gardner informed him that we have been working with the Park attorney Greg Reising and their architect Greg Jenkins. It was Gary's choice that the greenhouse be built in M. C. Bennett Park. Access to the greenhouse will be off 25th Avenue. A roadway will have to be built.

Legislative Committee - Committee Chairman Robert Trelo reported that the request of \$4 million for 97/99 biennial state funds has been forwarded in a letter to Kathy Davis, State Budget Director. Mr. Gardner added that the House has approved \$11 million in funding for the project. Approval is needed from the Senate next. Mr. Gardner acknowledged Rep. Dan Stevenson in the audience and thanked him for his interest and support.

Marina/Breakwater Committee - Committee Chairman Bill Tanke gave the Marina report. He reported that staff has received the draft as-builts of the marina site from Abonmarche. It is not in final form yet; latest increased proposal to agreement not approved yet until final as-builts are received.

Mr. Tanke referred to the letter in packet from NBD requesting the first interest payment on the marina bond. Mr. Gardner transmitted a letter to the city of Portage requesting the amount of \$14,387.30 to be approved by the Portage Board of Public Works so we can make our payment to NBD by the due date of October 1. John DeMeo made a motion to pay this amount to NBD; motion seconded by Bob Trelo; motion passed unanimously.

<u>Finance/Policy Committee</u> - Treasurer George Carlson gave the financial report. Mr. Carlson made a motion to approve the financial status statement for July and approve the claims for payment totaling \$76,526.03 plus the marina claim of \$14,387.30; motion seconded by Chuck Agnew: motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Carlson referred to the COE letter requesting NBD Bank to release \$60,000 from the design escrow account.

Other Business - None.

Statements from the floor - Bob Frum from Lefty's Coho Landing asked about the relationship we share with the city in regard to the marina. Mr. Tanke answered that the Commission owns the property the marina site sits upon and the city is the operator and maintainer of the marina through a Joint Venture Agreement signed with the City. Attorney Casale added that it is not a lease agreement but a joint venture agreement which allowed for cost-shared development with eventual pay-back from the city.

Mr. Frum questioned the legality of the "public" marina going into a dock fuel business and thus competing with private operators on the waterway. Mr. Gardner stated there was nothing in the present plan that calls for a fuel dock, but nothing prohibits the City from considering one in the future.

There being no further business, the next regular Commission meeting was scheduled for <u>Thursday</u>, <u>October 3</u>, <u>1996</u> in Portage.

COATS ANNOUNCES OVER \$40.8 MILLION DOLLARS FOR INDIANA PROJECTS INCLUDED IN THE ENERGY AND WATER APPROPRIATIONS BILL

WASHINGTON -- U.S. Sen. Dan Coats today announced over \$40.8 million in federal money for Indiana projects included in the Senate Energy and Water Appropriations Bill, which passed overwhelmingly today.

Federal funds for the Indiana projects will be available in the new fiscal year, beginning October 1.

Project funding is divided into three general areas: General Investigations, Construction, and Operation and Maintenance. General Investigations is explained below.

The \$40,832,000 is to be spent on projects across Indiana as follows:

Congress clears area water projects

WASHINGTON - Congress gave final approval Tuesday to funding that will help continue a massive flood control project along the Little Calumet River.

The \$11 million is earmarked for continued construction of levees and flood walls along 22 miles of the river, plus 13 runoff pumping plants, channel and bridge modifications and flood warning systems. It will bring the \$151 million project to 40 percent completion.

"It's a huge project, and we do it in stages," said Imad Samara, the Army Corps of Engineers' Little Calumet project manager. "We have to complete all the work in one area before we move

on to the next, so it's important to keep the momentum going."

President Clinton is expected to sign the bill, a \$20.4 billion water and energy spending package that includes a total of \$19 million for Northwest Indiana projects.

Also included in the bill is \$4 million for construction and rehabilitation work at Burns Harbor, which has been targeted for improvements intended to aid iron ore and steel traffic on the waterway.

Roughly \$1.2 million in additional funding will be put toward operations and maintenance needs, including \$5,000 for the small boat harbor.

Also approved Tuesday:

■\$2.2 million for start-up work on the Indiana shoreline project,

an effort aimed at combatting erosion.

■ \$600,000 to conduct dredging studies at Indiana Harbor. It will also be used for design and engineering work on a site next to the Indiana Harbor Ship Canal that will hold contaminated material dredged from the canal floor.

■\$200,000 to complete the engineering and design phase of the Cady Marsh Ditch flood control project.

■\$150,000 to study ways to combat flooding in the Little Calumet River basin's residential areas.

■\$100,000 to complete the design memorandum and develop the plans and specifications for the George Lake fish and wildlife restoration project in Hammond.

The preliminary draft of the Travel Policy as presented at the Commission meeting in July was prepared by staff at my request. My reasons were as follows: There was one past minor misunderstanding of telephone charges; there were NIRPC Commission members who had reservations purchased and then cancelled for no valid reason. There are also other practices which I have discussed with the State Board of Accounts people that may be questionable. This was, in my opinion, a valid reason for having guidelines, plus as one of the two members signing the claim forms, I did not want any problems with a State Board of Accounts Audit.

There was a discussion and questions raised. There was a committee meeting held in July, in which I thought all concerns and questions had been answered so a final draft was prepared. The final draft was presented at the August meeting at which time there was again discussion.

The discussion then was to get additional comments from the Commissioners at the September meeting and either pass or reject the Travel Policy as presented or amended. I think the policy as written is a good one; it gives directions to the members in a clear and concise manner. It simply states what the requirements of the State of Indiana are without having to resort to other documentation.

I have requested staff to not place this on this agenda for the September meeting. This decision is based on some of the discussions that have been held and which I feel should not be stated at a public meeting. Plus the fact that there are many more important problems facing this Commission and to get bogged down with further discussion on this matter is not in the best interests of expediting the project.

Please be advised, however, that I have instructed staff to revise the last draft and substitute the word "guidelines" for the word "policy". These are the guidelines I intend to follow in approving claims for payment, subject to a vote of the Commission directing me to do otherwise. I would suggest future Chairmen do the same.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE DEPARTMENT OF THE ARMY AND

THE LITTLE CALUMET RIVER BASIN DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION FOR CONSTRUCTION OF NON-FEDERAL IMPROVEMENTS ASSOCIATED WITH

THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE LITTLE CALUMET RIVER, INDIANA LOCAL FLOOD PROTECTION AND RECREATION PROJECT

THIS MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT (hereinafter referred to as the "Agreement") entered into this ______ day of _____, 199_ by and between the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA represented by the Department of the Army (hereinafter referred to as the "Government"), acting by and through the Commander, Chicago District, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, and the LITTLE CALUMET RIVER BASIN DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION, (hereinafter referred to as the "Commission"), acting by and through its Chairperson, effective as of the latest date indicated on the signature page.

----RECITALS-----

WHEREAS, construction of the Little Calumet River, Indiana Local Flood Protection and Recreation Project (hereinafter referred to as the "Project"), located on the Little Calumet River between the Illinois - Indiana State line and the Consolidated Rail Corporation railroad crossing in Gary, Indiana, was authorized by § 401 of the Water Resources Development Act of 1986 (P.L. 99-662), approved November 17, 1986, to be constructed substantially in accordance with Plan 3A contained in the Report to the Chief of engineers, dated June 2, 1984, for flood control and recreation purposes; and,

WHEREAS, the Government and the Commission entered into a Local Cooperation Agreement dated August 16, 1990, for the Little Calumet River, Indiana Local Flood Protection and Recreation Project which set forth the scope of the authorized project.

WHEREAS, in conjunction with the Project the Government has been requested to accomplish certain non-Federal work, i.e. recreational features, which are not part of the authorized Project, associated with Lake Etta Park; and,

WHEREAS, the Commission is willing to pay all costs of such work and to voluntarily deposit funds with the Government for that purpose; and,

WHEREAS, the Government under authority of 31 U.S.C. 6505 and 10 U.S.C. 3036(d) can provide reimbursable services to State and local governments; and,

WHEREAS, the Government under authority of 33 U.S.C. § 701(h) is authorized to accept and expend funds received from non-Pederal interests to pursue work on behalf of the 10-03-1996 15:55

non-Federal interests in conjunction with Federal project work when such additional work is determined to be in the public interest.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. Subject to any necessary appropriation, the Commission agrees to contribute to the Government the sum of forty seven thousand, one hundred Dollars (\$47,100) for engineering, design and construction of the Non-Federal Work referenced in Paragraph 2. Thirty (30) calendar days prior to the initiation of engineering and design, the Government shall notify the Commission of the required payment. Within fifteen (15) calendar days thereafter, the Commission shall deposit with the Government a check in the amount of forty seven thousand, one hundred Dollars (\$47,100), payable to "FAO USAED, Chicago". The Government will draw on such sums as the Government deems necessary to cover all costs incurred by the government directly related to the non-Federal Work which shall include all contractual and inhouse fiscal obligations attributable to the work referenced in Paragraph 2 as they are incurred, as well as costs incurred by the Government prior to the initiation of engineering, design and/or construction, (the above financial obligations hereinafter shall be collectively known as the "Costs").
- 2. The Government shall cause to be undertaken on behalf of the Commission the design, engineering and construction of recreational features associated with Lake Etta Park, i.e. an expansion to the existing parking lot as further provided in the scope of work (enclosure 1), attached hereto and made a part hereof. The above undertakings by the Government shall be collectively identified in this document as the "Work" provided, that the Government shall not obligate any funds contributed under this Agreement until such funds are received and available.
- 3. If at any time during the performance of the Design, Engineering or Construction the Government determines that the Costs will exceed forty seven thousand, one hundred Dollars (\$47,100), the Government shall so notify the Non-Federal Sponsor, and the Non-Federal Sponsor, not later than thirty (30) calendar days from receipt of such notice, shall contribute the necessary funds through the funding mechanism specified in Paragraph 1 of this Agreement. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, if the Government has reason to believe that the Costs will exceed forty seven thousand, one hundred Dollars (\$47,100), subsequent Work shall be deferred until such time as both parties to this Agreement agree to resume the Work.
- 4. The Government shall provide the Commission with annual accountings of its expenditures of contributed funds expended for the Work and in-house charges. The first such accounting shall be provided within thirty (30) calendar days after the final day of the first Government fiscal year following receipt of the contributed funds, and subsequent accountings shall be provided within thirty (30) calendar days after the final day of each succeeding year until the contributed funds are completely expended or the Government concludes the Work.

- 5. Upon completion of the Work, or upon notification of the Commission by the Government to terminate or not undertake the Work, and further upon the resolution of all relevant claims and appeals, the Government shall compute the total costs of the Work and render to the Commission a final accounting of the final costs of the Work. In the event that the total contribution by the Commission exceeds the total cost of the Work, the Government shall, no later than ninety (90) calendar days after the final accounting is complete return said excess to the Commission.
- 6. The Commission shall provide, in a form reasonably acceptable and at no cost to the Government, rights-of-entry over such lands as are necessary for the Work prior to the date the contract for the Work is awarded and the cost of any and all permits, whether Federal, State, or local, necessary for completion of the Work as provided in paragraph 2 above.
- 7. To provide for consistent and effective communication, the Commission and the Government shall, upon execution of the Agreement, appoint representatives to coordinate all facets of the Work, including design, scheduling, plans, award of contracts, contract modifications and change orders, contract costs, claims and other related matters.
- 8. Nothing herein shall constitute, or be deemed to constitute, an assurance or promise of the Government to take any action whatsoever with respect to the Work or the Project nor to obligate the Government to future appropriations.
- 9. Before any party to this Agreement may bring suit in any court concerning an issue relating to this Agreement, such party must first seek in good faith to resolve the issue through negotiation or other forms of nonbinding dispute resolution mutually acceptable to the partles.
- 10. Addendum number 1, if executed contemporaneously with this Agreement, shall be attached hereto and made a part hereof.

DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION OF LAKE COUNTY PARK'S PARKING LOT EXPANSION

- 1. The work will include design of an expansion to Lake County Park's parking area at Lake Etta. The expansion will transition into the Federal Parking Lot, to be located southeast of the existing Lake County Park's parking area.
- 2. In order to accomplish this work, the following tasks are required:
- Prepare "In-Roads" analysis to design final grading plan in transition area and generate cut and fill quantities. (2 MD)
- Revise all CADD drawings and specifications where needed. (3 MD)
- c. Prepare a Government cost estimate, revise the bid schedule. (2 MD)
- d. Perform in-house technical reviews of the new Plans & Specifications, respond and revise as needed. (2 MD)

- 3. Total engineering manpower required is 15 Mandays. Labor cost with overhead is \$7,500 for engineering and \$3,600 for construction management. The estimated construction cost is \$36,000. Hence, the total cost for design and construction of the Lake County Park's parking expansion is \$47,100.

ADDENDUM NUMBER 1 TO MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE DEPARTMENT OF THE ARMY AND

THE LITTLE CALUMET RIVER BASIN DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION FOR CONSTRUCTION OF NON-FEDERAL IMPROVEMENTS ASSOCIATED WITH

THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE LITTLE CALUMET RIVER, INDIANA LOCAL FLOOD PROTECTION AND RECREATION PROJECT

WHEREAS, the parties hereto have entered into a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) and desire to addend the MOA to include additional non-Federal work associated with the Project, and;

WHEREAS, the parties intend that this agreement shall supplement the MOA as hereinafter stated and in no other way alter the MOA.

THEREFORE, the parties agree to addend the MOA as follows:

- 1. Subject to any necessary appropriation, the Commission agrees to contribute to the Government the sum of fifteen thousand five hundred Dollars (\$15,500) for engineering and design of the non-Federal work referenced in Paragraph 2 as the Additional Work. Such additional contributions shall be as provided for in the MOA.
- 2. The Government shall cause to be undertaken on behalf of the Commission the design and engineering of recreational features associated with Lake Etta Park as further provided in the scope of work for "Redesign of the Federal Parking Lot" (enclosure 2) (hereinafter referred to as the "Additional Work"), attached hereto and made a part hereof.
- 3. If at any time during the performance of the Design and Engineering the Government determines that the Costs of the Additional Work will exceed fifteen thousand five hundred Dollars (\$15,500), the Government shall so notify the Non-Federal Sponsor, and the Non-

Federal Sponsor, not later than thirty (30) calendar days from receipt of such notice, shall contribute the necessary funds through the funding mechanism specified in Paragraph 1 of this MOA. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, if the Government has reason to believe that the Costs for the Additional Work will exceed fifteen thousand five hundred Dollars (\$15,500), subsequent Additional Work shall be deferred until such time as both parties to this Agreement agree to resume the Additional Work.

4. Except as herein provided, all other terms and conditions of this MOA shall remain in full force and effect.

SCOPE OF WORK

for

REDESIGN OF the FEDERAL PARKING LOT

- 1. The work will include redesign of the Federal parking area which was presented in the 100% BCOE plans and specifications submittal, and revision of the plans and specifications. This redesign is at the request of Lake County Parks.
- 2. In order to accomplish this work the following tasks are required:
- a. Redesign the parking lot geometry to include removal of the bus parking lane. The new geometry will accommodate bus traffic entering or exiting either of the two entrances and include parking lot transition. (2 MD)
- b. Shift entire parking area south to save the existing road configuration. (1 MD)
- c. Perform runoff and final grading plan required to accommodate sheet flow towards the south. (2 MD)
- d. Prepare "In-Roads" analysis to design final grading plan in parking area and generate cut and fill quantities. (2 MD)
- e. Revise all CADD drawings to reflect the above changes. (8 MD)
 - f. Revise specifications where needed. (2 MD)
- g. Prepare a new Government cost estimate, revise the bid schedule. (1MD)
- h. Perform in-house technical reviews of the new Plans & Specifications, respond and revise as needed. (8 MD)
 - j. Redesign intersection geometry & grading. (2 MD)
 - k. Supervision. (1 MD)
- l. Design pipe sleeve to pass under parking lot, including trench and fill requirements. (1 MD)
- m. Incorporate tree protection standards into specification. (1 MD)
- 3. Total manpower required is 31 Mandays. Labor cost with overhead is \$15,500.

Remediation Area

Dear Mr. Samara:

The Little Calumet River Basin Development Commission has directed us to prepare a conceptual plan for removing the area of the proposed Michael Jackson Theme Park from the flood plain. We are also attempting to develop a conceptual plan to provide for additional storage upstream of the Norfolk and Southern Railroad to reduce the flood stages downstream of the Railroad and thereby eliminate the need for remediation downstream including the site of the proposed Theme Park. In developing the conceptual plans, we have reviewed the Draft Post Authorization Report which addresses changes in the project east of the project's limits to comply with Indiana State Law. In addition we have reviewed a Memorandum dated February 5, 1996 entitled "A Preliminary Analysis to Determine the Effects of the Proposed Michael Jackson Theme Park on the One Percent Flood Event Maximum Stages".

As we have discussed, in developing our conceptual plans for the Little Calumet River Basin Development Commission we will need the assistance of Corps personnel to provide various information. Below is a further description of the Conceptual Plans as well as questions we have and information we need. The Corps assistance in providing answers to the questions or the needed information would be greatly appreciated.

Concept Plan No. 1

This conceptual plan is the same as configuration MJ3 in the February 5, 1996 Corps Memorandum except that the Little Calumet River Basin Development Basin Commission would like to use the property they own just north of the Little Calumet River (Burns Ditch) at Clay Street to store water and avoid the upstream and downstream impacts found in your MJ3 simulation.

In order to eliminate the upstream impacts we need to identify what improvements (or changes in your model assumptions) would be needed from the Norfolk and Southern Railroad to the Clay Street reservoir site. We have identified the following possible improvements along with information needed from the Corps.

- 1. Construct levees parallel to the Little Calumet River. Is the 100' setback used in modeling MJ3 adequate? If not, what setback is required? What is the recommended levee crest elevation? Where do levees need to be constructed, i.e. are levees from the Norfolk and Southern Railroad to Conrail needed?
- 2. Enlarging culverts under Martin Luther King Drive, I-65, Colorado Street, Central Avenue and Conrail. What size culverts are needed?

In order to eliminate downstream impacts we have identified the following possible improvements along with information needed from the Corps.

- 1. Construct a reservoir on the Clay Street site. What storage volume is needed to avoid remediation in Burn Ditch from the Clay Street site to Lake Michigan?
- 2. Construct a pumping station to pump flow into the reservoir. What capacity is suggested?

Since Deep River appears to have higher flood stages than the Little Calumet River, and considering the improvements outlined above, will Deep River flood stages cause higher flood stages in the Little Calumet River upstream of its confluence with Deep River?

Concept Plan No. 2

This conceptual plan proposes to provide additional storage upstream of the Norfolk and Southern Railroad to decrease flood stage increases to less than 0.15 feet, thereby eliminating the need for downstream remediation. A number of sites for this additional storage have been discussed. Those sites are as follows:

Ī	An area bounded by Martin Luther King Drive, I-80/94, I-65 and 33rd Avenue (extended).

The proposed Little Calumet River Basin Development Commission borrow site between Clark Road and Chase Street south of the Little Calumet River

The area bounded by the Levees between Chase Street and Grant Street. The storage volume in this area would be increased by excavating portions of the site to just above normal river stage.

In order to determine the feasibility of this concept including its potential cost, we need the Corps comments and recommended storage volumes at one or all of these sites.

Other Concepts

While identifying ideas that eliminate the need for downstream remediation, a couple of other ideas surfaced. Below are those ideas. The Corps comments on their feasibility and impact on eliminating the need for downstream remediation would be appreciated.

- 1. Construct a 0.5% flood event levee around the borrow pit lake at Interstate Plaza east of Indianapolis Boulevard with a 2% flood event levee between the Little Calumet River and the lake. This would allow this area to be used to store flow from larger floods while still preserving the area from the impact of more frequent floods.
- 2. Maximizing the allowable flow to Illinois.
