MINUTES OF THE LITTLE CALUMET RIVER BASIN DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION HELD AT 6:30 P.M. THURSDAY, MARCH 6, 1997 AT THE COMMISSION OFFICE 6100 SOUTHPORT ROAD HIGHLAND, INDIANA

Chairman Bob Huffman called the meeting to order at 6:40 p.m. Seven (7) Commissioners were present. Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Quorum was declared and guests were recognized.

The minutes of the February 6, 1997 meeting were approved by a motion from Roger Chiabai; motion seconded by Chuck Agnew; motion passed unanimously.

Executive Director's Report - Mr. Gardner referred to the letter from NAFSMA acknowledging our membership in their organization. We will now start receiving publications from them. We will pass onto Commissioners any pertinent publications staff thinks they would be interested in.

Mr. Gardner informed the Board that staff will be meeting tomorrow with town officials of Griffith, Richard Kortenhoven, COE, DNR and Lawson-Fisher in regards to the levee segment from Cline Ave. eastward to EJ&E RR. A private developer, R.Kortenhoven, plans to construct a portion of a levee in that vicinity. The town of Griffith will need to improve about 600' of existing levee. The levee will have to be built up to 100 year level with freeboard. It needs to be that elevation in order to obtain a DNR permit. A third segment of levee is unbuilt and uncommitted to at this time. Mr. Kortenhoven is ready to build but is lacking a permit. Efforts are ongoing to obtain that permit.

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<u>Land Acquisition Committee</u> - Committee Chairman Chuck Agnew referred to the COE letter in agenda packet accepting the Right-of-Entry for IV-2B without the vacation of streets, relying on the June 12, 1996 Street and Alley Agreement in lieu thereof.

Mr. Agnew also reported that all agreements are in place that allow us to sign the ROE for Recreation Phase 1. Mr. Gardner added that we will do some press releases and that the city of Hammond will plan a signing ceremony for OxBow Park.

<u>Project Engineering Committee</u> - Committee Chairman Bob Huffman spoke on the flood warning and preparedness meeting held on February 25th at the Lake County Emergency Management Agency. It was very well attended by all five communities involved, COE, IDNR, SEMA, USGS, NIPSCO and others. Mr. Gardner added that, from the demonstration, he thinks everyone could really see, firsthand, how this tool will really be helpful to everyone.

Maintenance was also discussed. We need to develop a mechanism and funding source for maintenance - not only in flood times, but all the time. Mr. Pokrajac added that this meeting was an excellent opportunity to present to everyone how this will interact for their respective community. Some communities have not submitted emergency plans yet but will do so very soon. It was stressed that it is critical that emergency plans be in place before there is an emergency.

Legislative Committee - Committee Chairman George Carlson referred to the news article in the agenda packet listing projects that were included in the state budget that was approved by the House Ways and Means Committee and will now be forwarded onto the Senate for approval. \$2 million was included for the Development Commission. Mr. Gardner added that \$2 million was also included for marina development in Portage. (This will allow Phase 2 additional slip development).

Mr. Gardner stated that as soon as the session is over and the State Budget Committee meets, it is imperative that we be on their agenda for drawdown of the '91 appropriated funds. We are at a all-time low of available monies to draw upon.

Mr. Carlson and Mr. Gardner both expressed gratitude to the legislators for their support.

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Marina/Breakwater Committee - Committee Chairman Bill Tanke referred to the letter to John Hannon requesting the second bond payment from the city. That payments amounts to \$28,643.84. Mr. Tanke made a motion to approve the marina claim sheet listing the \$28,643.84 and another \$48.25 to NBD for year end analysis bank charge; motion seconded by Roger Chiabai; motion passed unanimously.

He informed the Board that a new Request for Proposals has been developed by the city for Phase 2 marina development. If we were to assume that the \$2 million is secured for the LMMDC for Portage marina development, we should be able to start constructing about the end of the boating season this year.

Mr. Tanke referred to the Abonmarche letter regarding some of the wood pilings heaving. They have determined that it is not a defective installation by the contractor but rather the wood pilings have jacked because of the ice uplift from the winter season. They are currently seeking estimates for repair cost.

Finance/Policy Committee - Treasurer Chuck Agnew gave the financial report. He referred to a revised claim sheet distributed to the Board members where a claim for the City of Gary for the Burr Street pump station construction has been added. Mr. Agnew made a motion to approve the financial status statement for January and approve the claims for payment totaling \$452,067.39; motion seconded by Roger Chiabai; motion approved unanimously.

He also stated that we have received the IDNR letter requesting the Commission's share of the yearly cost of operation and maintenance of several gaging stations that amounts to \$17,200.

Mr. Gardner added that the State Board of Accounts has just finished their '94 and '95 audit of the Commission. One item was noted in that we have the tax escrow fund line overdrawn in 1995. Mr. Gardner will respond in writing to that item giving reason why and how we will work to correct it.

Other Business - No other Commission business at this time.

Statements from the floor - Bob Frum from Lefty's Coho, inquired whether the City has realized a tax benefit from the marina construction. He understood that the public city marina was suppose to create tax dollars. Mr. Gardner explained how the process proceeded in that the breakwater construction was a 50/50 cost share between the Federal government and the Commission who used State dollars to account for our share. \$1.7 million of State tax dollars financed our portion of the breakwaters. The COE

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calculated a recreational/economic benefit which resulted in an obligation to the Commission to see constructed a ± 200 slip public use marina.

There being no further business, the next regular Commission meeting was scheduled for <u>Thursday</u>, <u>April 3, 1997</u> in Portage.

Dear Mr. Gardner:

This letter is written as a fallow up to our conversation in the February 20 1997 real estate meeting. At the meeting I left with you three copies of the draft Burr Street Betterment Levee Feature Design Memorandum (FDM). We would like you to review and comment on this draft FDM. Your prompt response is needed so that we can finalize this FDM and move to the next step which is developing the Plans and Specifications (P&S) for this project.

As I stated in the meeting, for the construction to continue on the Little Calumet River Project, it is very critical that Burr Street Levee be in construction by the summer of 1998. The reason behind that is the Betterment Levee, as you know, is to be built in place of the flood proofing. The sequence of construction would have been that the flood proofing would be done first before we start constructing the levees. Now that the Burr Street Betterment levee is the implemented plan, delay was encountered when we changed the course of work from preparing Plans and Specifications for the flood proofing to preparing the betterment levee FDM. As the construction continues in the East Reach of this project, the Betterment Levee area is being impacted with higher flood stages. And now that Stage IV-2B is scheduled for award in the summer of 1997, it is very important that the Betterment Levee construction overlaps the construction of IV-2B. What this means is that Burr Street Betterment Levee will have to be ready for construction in the summer of 1998. For us to meet such a schedule we have to get back to work on this FDM as soon as possible. We would like your comments to be at our offices no later than This will allow us to continue work on March 21 1997. the FDM and complete it in June 1997. This will allow us to be on schedule to award a construction contract in June of 1998.

It is also necessary that any outstanding issues have to be resolved now. One issue that I would like to bring up is your concerns about the levee alignment running to the EJ & E Rail Road embankment rather than the way it is shown in the FDM. My suggestion in the past and still is to delay this decision until the Cady Marsh Ditch FDM is completed. This change can be dealt with in the Plans and Specifications phase. The one item connected with this issue that can not be delayed is obtaining geotechnical borings along the EJ & E alignment. If you think there is a slight possibility you will request the change in the levee alignment, I suggest that your office initiate a contract to obtain I would offer the assistance of our this information. geotechnical engineer Leslie Tacon to help you with this task. This geotechnical work can delay the schedule if it is not done now.

The last item that I need to bring up is that presently this project is out of funds. For us to get back and work on this project we need additional funds. In accordance with article 3 of the Memorandum of Agreement executed January 8, 1992, for the Burr Street Betterment Levee, to complete this FDM we are requesting an additional amount of \$50,000. This money is needed to cover the in-house review process, the appraisals review and the work to complete the FDM. This shortage been encountered as a result of trying to resolve the pump station issues with the City of Gary and resolving the levee alignment.

Dear Roland:

I am writing you to inform you that at the March 6th Board meeting of the Little Calumet River Basin Development Commission, the Board approved for payment the amount of \$384,399 as previously indicated available for the Burr Street pump station. It will be made available payable to the city of Gary as the identified local project sponsor with INDOT.

The Board is also cognizant of two overall project cost reductions that should reduce the needed participation of the Commission as well as the Lake County Highway Department and the city of Gary. We are aware the actual bid amount came in at \$200,000 under the State's estimate and also an additional \$464,000 in Federal funding was made available to cover 80% Federal participation in the entire project, including the increased size in the pump station.

Based on these two cost reductions, the Development Commission board members feel that the Commission's share of the project should be appropriately reduced. They noted the \$384,399 amounts to 83.5% of the needed local share for the total pump station project; and 60% of the local share required for the entire construction project, thus helping reduce needed local share required by Lake County and the city of Gary. This should be more than adequate to meet the Commission's obligation toward the project and, therefore, it is the Board's position that there should be no need for futher contributions.

We feel this approach benefits all cooperating parties. If there is need for any further discussion, please feel free to call me at 219/763-0696. Thank you for your cooperation.

Dear Roland,

Enclosed, for your information, is a copy of the ongoing contracts from last year and the haul routes we have been using. Also enclosed is a copy of the proposed haul routes for the upcoming 1997 construction season. As we had discussed with the army corps on March 27, 1997, we would request that you present this to the Board of Public Works at the upcoming meeting scheduled for April 2. This information includes which streets you would allow loaded, or empty, trucks to travel.

In addition, we have several road closures during the upcoming construction year including Clark Street north of the Little Calumet River, Harrison Street south of the Little Calumet River, and Georgia Street north of 32nd Avenue. All three of these closures will be to do a road raising to bring the elevation up to the 200 year level of protection and allow minimum flood control during a major event. Clark Street will have culverts installed underneath to allow drainage to flow from west to east to the Little Calumet River. It is our intent to notify you in writing a minimum of 15 days prior to our start of construction. In addition, it is our intent that Clark Street will be closed no longer than 60 days, Harrison Street no longer than 30 days, and Georgia Street no longer than 60 days.

We would like to minimize the impact of construction to the City of Gary during this upcoming season and realize the extent of the amount of work that will be completed during this season. We are working toward our goal of completing all of the flood control work in Gary as quickly as land and money are available to do so. Reference is made to a letter dated September 24, 1996 from Lawson-Fisher Associates P.C., requesting approval as a flood control levee for the segment of the proposed earthen embankment to be reconstructed along the south boundary of the above-mentioned project previously approved by the Department of Natural Resources on August 11, 1995. The proposed segment of the earthen embankment to be upgraded for flood control purposes is located approximately 2,600' south of the Cline Avenue crossing over the Little Calumet River and extends east from Cline Avenue along the southern property boundary for a distance of approximately 1,100' in the S½, SW¼, NW¼, of Section 23, Township 36 North, Range 9 West, at Griffith, Calumet Township, Lake County.

The portions of the previously-approved project description, which will be affected by your request, are as follows:

... the reconstruction of approximately 4,026 linear feet of an existing earthen embankment so that the new embankment will have an 18' crest width and 2:1 side slopes. Details of the project are contained in plans and information received at the Division of Water on May 2, 1994; March 24, 1995; and April 3, 1995.

Based on the information received at the Division of Water on September 25, 1996, the portions of the above-mentioned project description for the original permit will be amended as follows:

... the reconstruction of approximately 4,026 linear feet of an existing earthen embankment to an 18' crest width and 2:1 side slopes. Additionally, the southernmost segment of the embankment located between Stations 50+25 and 61+27 will be reconstructed to a minimum crest elevation of 602.2', NGVD, a crest width of 18', and 2:1 side slopes for status as an approved flood control levee. Details of the project are contained in plans and information received at the Division of Water on May 2, 1994; March 24, 1995, April 3, 1995; and September 25, 1996.

Department staff has completed its review of your proposed modifications to the plans previously approved under Application No. FW-16,109 and determined that the proposed south levee segment will provide 3.2' of freeboard above the 100-year flood elevation of 599.0', NGVD, at the project site and will meet the stability requirements for different loading conditions, including earthquake conditions, normal pool, and elevated pool at the 100-year flood elevation provided it is constructed according to the design plans and specifications received at the Division of Water on September 25, 1996. Approval is, therefore, granted for classification of the proposed south levee segment, between Stations 50+25 and 61+27 only, as a flood control levee.

This letter should be attached to the existing permit and displayed at the project site. The Division of Water will place a copy in our permit file to be retained as a permanent part of the application. All conditions listed on the original permit must be followed in order for the project to be in compliance.

You should not construe this letter to be a local building permit, or a waiver of the provisions of local building or zoning ordinances.

You may also have to obtain a permit from the Corps of Engineers under Section 404 of the Clean Water Act or Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act. Information relative to the Corps of Engineers permits may be obtained from:
