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



The minutes of the November 5th and the November 24th, 1998 meeting were approved by a motion from Bob Huffman after several corrections were made. On the minutes for the November 5th the list showing which Commissioners were present, delete Emerson Delaney and add George Carlson and Arlene Colvin. Also change location of meeting to Portage (not Highland). On the November 24th minutes, delete the work "Development" from Lake Erie Land Company; motion was seconded by Chuck Agnew; motion passed unanimously.

<u>Chairman's Report</u> – Chairman Bob Trelo referred to the appointment status sheet each Commissioner received showing the status of their respective appointment. Several appointments are up or soon to be up.

Executive Director's Report — Mr. Gardner referred to the letter in the agenda packet received from David Sanford, Chief of the Policy Div. for Civil Works at the COE Washington office. Mr. Gardner expressed his displeasure in the Commission not being able to present their case to the COE before a decision was rendered (as we had asked them). The letter basically says that the Commission would not be allowed credit for the flowage easements (approx. \$550,000 credit value). Mr. Gardner has called Washington and confirmed that we did receive the letter, we would respond to the letter, and we were disappointed we were not given the opportunity to go before them before a decision was rendered. It was discussed that we will have to call upon Congressman Visclosky to help us out. With the Congressman's appointment to the Water Resource Committee in Washington, his support to our project/request would be beneficial. Attorney Casale added that arbitration may be used. With the Local Cooperation Agreement in place, he sees it as a contract violation. Staff will pursue and keep Commission informed.

<u>Land Acquisition Committee</u> – Committee Chairman Chuck Agnew stated that the 45 farmable acres at 35th & Chase would be advertised out for a lease to farm. Staff will report back.

Mr. Agnew stated that the dedication of Gleason Park on October 27th was very nice. The Mayor attended and seemed very pleased with the outcome of the recreational features that were put in at Gleason Park, as a result of our project.

Mr. Gardner added that the COE is pressing us for comments on the Operation & Maintenance Manual. We hope to have all comments together by middle of January to officially submit to the COE by early February. If Commissioners have any further comments they want included, please get them to staff as soon as possible.

Mr. Gardner also stated that the mitigation agreement with Lake Erie Land Company is approved and signed. All mitigation agreements will need permits before completion. All designs and approvals must come back to the Board for concurrence.

<u>Project Engineering Committee</u> – Committee Chairman Bob Huffman reported that a letter was received from the COE describing the levee failure, what they engineered and why it failed. There were 2 levee failures last construction season which caused great concern to us. The construction this season is about completed. Testing of pump stations is ongoing now. Three new segments of levee construction is anticipated for 1999.

<u>Legislative Committee</u> – Committee Chairperson Arlene Colvin stated that Dan Gardner attended the State Budget Committee meeting in Indianapolis on November 18th to request approval of the remaining appropriated funds of \$2 million. All monies that have been

appropriated to us have now been allocated. There are no reserve monies. With the upcoming construction contracts anticipated for 1999, it is critical the Commission receive a higher appropriation this legislative biennium. Mr. Gardner had contact Senator Alexa, who is the newest member of the State Budget Committee, and enlisted his support. In the agenda packet, staff wrote a thank you letter to him for his support.

Marina Committee – Committee Chairman Bill Tanke informed the Board that the corner marina sign is up and looks good. There was a slight overrun on the sign cost. Mr. Tanke made a motion to approve the claim of \$10,172.15 (original amount was \$10,130); motion seconded by Chuck Agnew; motion passed unanimously. Staff will look into closing out the marina construction account that was previously set up to allow payment for particular marina costs. This sign construction cost is expected to be the last cost that would be incurred at the marina site. After paying this claim, it is anticipated that about \$11,640 would be left in the account. Staff will see if this can be applied toward the bond payment.

Finance Committee — Committee Chairman George Carlson made a motion to approve a budget transfer of \$500 from Line 5812 (NIRPC services) to Line 5811 (Legal Expenses); motion seconded by Bob Huffman; motion passed unanimously. Mr. Carlson then referred to the financial status report and claim approval list. He made a motion to accept the financial report and approve claims totaling \$74,302.86; motion seconded by Bob Huffman; motion passed unanimously. Mr. Carlson then referred to the NIRPC contract for administrative services. Page 17 in the packet lists out the exact changes/increases in the contract. The contract will be acted upon at the January meeting. Mr. Gardner stated that the NIRPC as well as services contracts will be presented and acted on in January.

Recreational Development Committee – In Committee Chairman Emerson Delaney's absence, Jim Pokrajac thanked Chuck Agnew for his attendance at the Gleason Park dedication on October 27th. He also thanked Bob Huffman for his attendance at the COE walk thru for trail crossings. On November 20th, there was a final inspection at Deep River. Only some minor regrading and seeding need to be done there. There will also be a dedication in the spring for Lake Etta Park in Gary.

<u>Minority Contracting Committee</u> – Committee Chairman Marion Williams thanked Imad Samara, project manager for the COE, for the minority figures of past contracts. It will be shared with the Committee members.

<u>Other Business</u> – Mr. Anew stated that at the next meeting, some financial matters will be addressed. The Finance Committee will be meeting prior to the January meeting.

There being no further business, the next regular Commission meeting was scheduled for 6:00 p.m. Thursday, January 7, 1999.

- a. Memorandum, CELRC-DDE(PM), 19 August 1997, and endorsements, subject: Post Authorization Change (PAC) Report, Little Calumet River, Indiana, Flood Control and Recreation Project.
- b. Memorandum, CELRC-PP-PM, 20 March 1998, subject: Little Calumet River, Indiana, Local Flood Control and Recreation, Post Authorization Change Report, May 1997.
- c. Letter, 11 May 1998, from the Little Calumet River Basin Development Commission to Headquarters (enclosure 1) and our 13 November 1998 response (enclosure 2).
- 2. The second endorsement (CECW-PC, 17 November 1997) to reference 1.a. provided Headquarters policy review comments on the subject report. The District's responses to the comments were transmitted via reference 1.b. The Headquarters assessment of the District responses (enclosure 3) was completed on 12 May 1998, but formal guidance was not issued pending resolution of the issue raised by the project sponsor via reference 1.c..
- 3. As documented in enclosure 3, we concur that modification of the project to include construction of 4000 feet of levee and acquisition of 5 residential structures and 2 mobile homes is justified to mitigate for the adverse social effects of induced flooding in the community of Marshalltown and is within the Chief of Engineers discretionary authority. It was also concluded that there is no justification for including flowage easements on 415 acres of agricultural and vacant lands as part of the Federal project, even though the easements are necessary to comply with State of Indiana induced flooding mitigation requirements. In response to the sponsor's request (enclosure 1) that credit be afforded for the value of the flowage easements under the terms of the existing Project Cooperation Agreement (PCA), Headquarters reaffirmed (enclosure 2) that the flowage easements are a non-Federal responsibility for which no credit will be afforded.

- 4. The project modification is approved subject to Headquarters verification of the PAC report revisions required to comply with enclosure 3.
- 5. Modification of the project requires an amendment to the PCA to describe the work and to reference the appropriate decision document. The revised PAC report will meet the decision document requirements of EC 1165-2-204, paragraph 7. Since there is no approved model or delegated authority for PCA amendments, the draft PCA amendment must be submitted to Headquarters (CECW-AR) for review and approval (EC 1165-2-204, paragraph 10). The draft PCA modification and revised PAC report may be submitted concurrently to Headquarters for review and approval. To assist in expediting review, the transmittal of the revised report should include a document identifying where the report has been revised to address Headquarters guidance and any other significant changes that have been made to the original report.

I would like to thank you again for your interest and involvement in our public meeting and for providing my office with information about problems and concerns you have regarding storm water in your area. My office has reviewed each of the forms which were filled out. Those problems within our purview which could be immediately addressed by my office have been, and those problems which are more effectively or appropriately addressed by other offices, departments or municipal governments have been referred to the appropriate body and will be monitored by my office to encourage resolution in spite of our lack of direct jurisdiction.

For many of the specific concerns expressed, a regional or "big picture" approach will need to be taken. The information about these problems has been collated by my office and provided to our engineers, who are currently involved in analyzing the problems and formulating possible solutions in each individual watershed. According to their schedule, I am expecting a preliminary analysis and report early in 1999, and a final report sometime later for the areas in question. Once I receive this information, I will begin the process of determining which solutions can be best implemented in terms of time and money, along with what interlocal cooperation is needed and possible. As always, I will seek your input as we develop our priorities.

Meanwhile, please feel free to contact my office with any questions or additional information you may have. We will continue to try to keep you informed as we progress towards a comprehensive and long-term stormwater management solution.

RECREATION - GENERAL

- A. We have requested a recreation (project-type) map from the COE showing all recreation features, including trails, fishing piers, observation decks, and all out support facilities.(Ongoing)
 - A letter was sent to the COE on Dec. 17th requesting access ramps that are part of the recreational trail system be paved to prevent erosion.
- B. We have investigated the possibility of paving levee top trails. This would apply to areas whereby existing stoned trails have been installed as part of the project.
 - We received an <u>estimate</u> from Walsh and Kelly to pave the 9' wide levee crest on top of the previously stoned recreation trails The cost estimate indicates approx. \$6.90/sy.
- C. We had a conference call with the COE on July 28th, 1998 to review problems with overall trail layout for the project relative to road and railroad crossing areas.
 - 1. A field review was held with the COE on October 6th to review crossings with railroads and streets throughout the project.
 - 2. The final review and comments are ongoing.
- D. We will coordinate with Lake County Parks in the spring to coordinate an effort to get volunteers to clean up the Little Calumet River.







 Dyer/Ellas Construction – Contract price \$1,220,386

STATUS (Stage II Phase 3A) Georgia to Martin Luther King - South Levee:

Project completed on January 13, 1995.
 Ramirez & Marsch Construction – Contract price \$2,275,023

<u>Landscaping Contract (This contract includes all completed levee segments – installing, planting zones, seeding, and landscaping):</u>

- 1. Contractor is Dyer Construction
- 2. Contract amount is \$1,092,050
- 3. Some plantings and seeding did not take as per COE plans and specifications
 The Contractor (Dyer Construction) is making a field inspection of the entire project
 with the COE and will complete by next spring as the weather permits.

STATUS (Stage II Phase 3B) Harrison to Georgia - South Levee:

- 1. Rausch Construction started on 11/20/95. Set up field headquarters north of I.U., west of Broadway. (Construction is approx. 98% complete)
 - A. Projected segment completion is in the spring some fine grading and seeding.
- 2. Received cost estimate for Broadway pump station from NIPSCO (\$8,408)
 - A. All wiring is now completed, pumps are hooked up, and contractor needs water to do operational test Scheduling for tests is ongoing.
 - B. Final testing and turnover to Gary Sanitary District is pending. Waiting on contractor response to complete testing. (Still waiting to schedule operational test)

STATUS (Stage II Phase 3C2) Grant to Harrison:

- The overall project is 98% complete, and the final scheduled completion is for the end of January, 1999.
- 2. The operational test for this pump station was held on November 19th, 1998, with LCRBDC, COE, GSD, and the City of Gary.
 - A. The tests were completed and the pump station was found to be satisfactory as per Army corps plans and specs with the exception of minor punch list items. (These are currently being completed.)
 - B. A letter was sent to the COE on December 17th, 1998, requesting a list of information and materials needed to turn over the pump station to GSD.



- 3. The drainage problem around Gilroy Stadium has been addressed by the Army Corps.
 - **A.** We received a modified design from the COE on November 12, 1998, showing the extension of the 15" RCP under Harrison and draining to the control structure and ditch system as part of the II-3B project.
 - B. The COE will install the pipe under Harrison in the spring to allow for proper stoning, compaction, and paving.

STATUS (Stage II Phase 4) Broadway to MLK Drive - North Levee:

- 1. All structural levee work completed. All grading and backfilling have been completed.
 - A. Project is approx. 98% completed and the anticipated overall completion is for early spring.
 - · Minor grading and seeding will be done when the weather permits.
- 2. Seven gatewells have been constructed. Testing and operating preliminary testing of these gatewells has been completed, and found to be operational.
 - A. Preliminary gatewell testing has been completed by the contractor, and final testing with the COE hydrology department still need to be scheduled.
- 3. This portion of levee construction has been completed.
 - A. Walkway to Ironwood pump station has been completed as of December 1st, 1998.
 - B. The pump station has been completed and is ready to be tested. (The meter is scheduled to be installed as of December 9th, 1998, which will begin the 30 month payback agreement to NIPSCO by the GSD.)

STATUS (STAGE III) Chase to Grant Street:

- Project completed on May 6th, 1994.
 Kiewit Construction Contract price \$6,564,520.
- COE investigating drainage problems caused by levee installation in Stage III. This is affecting the N.W. IN Foodbank and properties along the west side of Grant Street, and the area south of 35th, east of Chase (Ongoing)
 - A. A letter was written to the COE on July 22nd, 1998, questioning their intent for interior drainage design, along with a copy of a survey dated July 9th, 1998, showing drainage elevations in this area.
 - A second letter was sent out referencing our field visit with the COE and our discussions on the site on Sept. 17th.
 - B. A letter of response was received from the COE on October 14th, 1998, indicating the FDM 2 did not address the area because it would be addressed in the mitigation plan.
 - They indicated that now that this area is not included as part of their mitigation plan, they will do a more detailed design to provide a better cost estimate.

STATUS (Stage IV Phase 1) Cline to Burr: This area was modified to include the drainage system from Colfax to Burr on June 21st, 1995.

1. As per the December 22nd, 1998 Real Estate meeting, the COE indicated a revised contract award date of June 6th, 1999.

- 2. COE has completed the engineering review with Tichenor Media (WIND Radio).

 A. The cables will not be exposed but can be approximated on the COE drawings and the actual locations will be determined in the field during construction by the contractor. (This is shown on the survey and location drawings by Great Lakes Engineering.)
- 3. A survey contract has been given to Great Lakes Engineering in the amount not to exceed \$2,690. This work will include elevations of the top of the concrete bases for the (4) towers, utility locations, plat of survey of the overall property, elevations and locations of underground cables, as estimated by the WIND engineer.
 - Survey information was provided to the COE for the tower locations and elevations, access roadway, building locations, and railroad R/W's on December 9th, 1998.
- 4. A "plan-in-hand" meeting was held with the COE, on December 16th, 1998 to review with both RR's and Ayres Associates (COE engineering consultant). Drawings and specs were reviewed and discussed in the office, then visited in the field.
 - Many items appear to have to be modified including levee alignment and drainage system design.
- 5. A value engineering study was done by the Chicago COE to review ways to save money on this levee segment & still meet design criteria.
 - A conference call was held on October 15th to review these items and a letter was sent to the COE on October 20th with our concerns. (100% BCOE drawings were submitted to us without any comments from our conference call).
- 6. A letter was received from the COE on December 1st, 1998, (dated November 25th) requesting engineering review of the 100% BCOE by December 18th, 1998.
 - We submitted a letter to the COE on December 7th, 1998, indicating that we had trouble doing an accurate review until we received comments from an earlier V.E. study as well as a response to our earlier comments from March 20th, 1998.
 - The COE sent a very confusing letter of response to our December 7th, 1998 letter on December 18th, 1998 indicating why we never received responses to our March 20th, 1998 letter or our V.E. requests.
- 7. COE sent a letter to the Lake County Highway Consulting Engineer on November 30th, 1998, for Colfax Bridge regarding design of our project in that area.
 - We sent a letter to the Lake Co. Highway Dept. on December 17th, 1998, requesting scheduling information for their Colfax bridge in order to coordinate our contract with theirs to minimize downtime for the street closure.

STATUS (Stage IV Phase 2A) Burr to Clark - Lake Etta:

- Scheduled Notice to Proceed in Nov. of 1995. (Dyer Construction is successful low bidder). Currently 95% completed.
 - A. The projected, overall, project completion is for early spring when minor grading and seeding can be completed.
- 2. The pump station is complete.
 - A. Operational inspection is scheduled for mid-**February**. Will also serve as the final inspection and turnover with GSD.

STATUS (Stage IV Phase 2B) Clark to Chase

- 1. Had a pre-construction meeting with Dyer Construction for Stage IV Phase 2B on 8/21/97. 100% of levee construction has been completed, and the projected overall completion is for mid-December. (Minor planting and grading to be done in the spring.)
 - Although pre-loading was done, settlement caused a break in the joint from the headwall to the gatewell. This will be allowed to further settle until the spring, upon which the repair will be made.

STATUS (Betterment Levee) EJ&E to Burr Street (North of NIPSCO R/W), across RR, then north of railroad R/W eastward ½ way to Clark, thence south.

- 1. COE projects levee installation along the east R/W line of the EJ&E RR across the NIPSCO north R/W line, then extending levee east from the EJ&E RR along the north side of the NIPSCO R/W, thence east to Burr Street, thence north across the Norfolk Southern RR, then East (north of the RR right-of-way) ½ way between Burr and Clark, then back south over the RR, and then going back approx. 1400' south.
- 2. We received a letter from the COE on July 7th, 1998 (dated June 26th) requesting a survey for the utility impacts along the NIPSCO R/W with NIPSCO, Wolverine, and Marathon.
 - A. A utility coordination meeting was held with the COE, NIPSCO, Marathon, Jim Flora and Jim Pokrajac on October 20th.
 - Casing of pipelines, cover over pipelines, and real estate impacts were discussed and the feedback is being incorporated into the design.
 - B. We received a letter from the COE on December 11th, 1998 (dated December 7th) providing settlement information at Colfax and Calhoun Streets and requesting input from the utilities at these locations.
 - Letters were sent out to NIPSCO and Marathon on December 29th, 1998, requesting their review and comments.
- Contract for surveying services was awarded to Great Lake Engineering (refer to Land Acquisition Report) Survey to be completed no later than January 15th, 1999.
- 4. Completed engineering review to the COE & sent comments on December 7th, 1998.

STATUS Cline to EJ&E RR - Local Project:

- 1. No protection at this time from Cline Ave. to Arbogast. (Locally protection will be provided).
 - The permitting for mitigation is ongoing (we agreed to let them use 9 acres of our land northwest of the Mansards)
- 2. A coordination meeting will be held with the Town of Griffith on January 8th, 1999, to review status of agreements with the EJ&E R.R. and the levee from Cline to the EJ&E.

STATUS (Stage V Phase 1) Wicker Park Manor:

Project completed on September 14, 1995.
 Dyer Construction – Contract price \$998,630



- 2. As per a conversation with Phillips Pipeline on 9/30/96, consideration is being given to do a directional bore or both 8" lines, rather than do 2 "up and overs" for both levees (This has been ongoing with the COE since November of 1996)
 - A. The COE indicated in their response for Stage V Phase 2, that this was not economically feasible. We still contend this should be done as an item of safety.
 - B. See <u>Status (Stage V Phase 2)</u>
 Item #4 for update on directional drilling.

STATUS (Stage V Phase 2):

- At the July 23rd, 1998 Real Estate meeting, the current schedule shows a January 1st, 2001 contract award date.
- 2. A letter was written to the COE on June 16th, 1998, including the (7) major items of concern of the engineering review previously submitted to them on June 1st.
 - The COE wrote a letter of response on October 23rd and suggested a meeting to discuss and further review these items.
- 3. We received a letter from the COE on December 17th, 1998, requesting we coordinate with Munster on the Baring Pump Station and set up a meeting to review their revised scope of work.
- 4. We received a letter from the COE on Sept. 11^{th, 1998} in response to our concern of doing a directional bore for the 2 Phillips pipelines west of the Conrail RR dated Nov. 6, 1996.
 - Letter sent to Phillips on Sept. 11th enclosing COE information on directional drilling for their response. (The COE stated in their letter dated October 23rd (Item #2) that PPL submit a detailed design analysis for review & approval by the COE). (ongoing)

STATUS (Stage V Phase 3) Woodmar Country Club:

- At the July 23rd, 1998 Real Estate meeting, the current schedule shows a July 1st, 1999 contract award date.
 - We feel this date is non-realistic. With the funding available, a 2001 date would be more realistic.
- 2. Completed engineering review of Hart Ditch control structure and submitted comments to the COE on March 23, 1998.
 - Still awaiting response to our comments. (ongoing)

STAGE VI:

- 1. Had meeting on 1/18/96 with Super 8, Holiday Inn, and Motel 6 with the COE attending regarding levee impact to the properties and how we will proceed.
 - A. We are in the process of doing a feasibility study to determine impact, get fair market values, etc. (in process of assigning). We have received pertinent information from all hotels.
 - Refer to stage VI in Land Acq. report. (Item #2)
 - B. Construction has been re-scheduled from spring of 1998 to a contract award date of January 7th, 2001.

2. We received a request from the COE to do additional survey work throughout the project area. They requested stakeouts for property lines which could be very expensive. We are awaiting a cost estimate from Cole Associates.

East Reach Remediation Area - North of 180/94, MLK to I-65:


- 1. We received a backcheck set from the COE to review at our real estate meeting on October 21st. We completed our review and comments by October 30th.
 - We received a letter from the COE on December 31st, 1998 (dated December 29th) with their responses to our backcheck comments.
- 2. Received a letter from the COE on November 23rd, 1998 (dated November 20th) requesting our coordination with Gary to clarify if 15" RCP storm sewer south of the Bethune Elementary School is abandoned.
 - We received a letter from the GSD on December 16th, 1998, indicating they need to maintain this storm sewer.
 - We sent a letter to the COE on December 21st, 1998, enclosing this letter and recommending the COE revise their plans.
 - We received a letter from the COE on December 28th, 1998, recommending that the pipe be re-located outside the levee work limits.
 - We sent a letter with our recommendations, to the COE on December 30th,
 1998, indicating more cost efficient methods to keep the pipe in service.
- 3. Received a letter from the COE on November 16th, 1998, requesting that we get a state certified asbestos inspection to certify no asbestos in demolition area prior to construction.
 - · We are holding until the PAC is approved.

West Reach:

- 1. We received a letter from the COE (dated November 5th, 1998) on November 12th, updating us on the status of the upcoming pump station contracts.
 - They are proposing to release pump station contract 1 to fiscal year 1999. Chicago COE will continue "in house" for all the Hammond pump stations
 - COE reconsidered position on rehabilitating the pumps to replacing the pumps with new pumps as originally stated in FDM 5.
 - We received a letter from the COE dated December 17th, 1998, enclosing scope of work information and requesting our coordination with Munster and Hammond. They also requested our comments no later than January 2nd, 1999.
 - We sent a letter to the COE on December 30th, 1998, indicating we need coordination meetings with the communities.

Stages VII and VIII:

- Will have public meeting with communities to gather information prior to doing prints & specs.
 - It is the intent of the COE to contract out all engineering for both of these stages.



 The final review of engineering proposals should be completed by the COE by mid-December to determine the engineering consultant for both of these levee segments.

General:

- 1. Wrote a letter to NIPSCO on June 10th, 1998, requesting their investigation into providing security (gates) to prevent access onto our properties along their tower R/W from Arbogast to Chase. (ongoing)
 - NIPSCO indicated this work will be done in January, 1999, when new money is available.
- 2. Wrote a letter to the COE on December 9th, 1998, regarding our participation in providing ongoing utility status reports.
 - We have not done this on the last several projects because the COE A/E did their own utility coordination and reports, and we recommend continuing this process in the future because it is more efficient and cost-effective.
- 3. A letter was written to the COE on December 17th, 1998, requesting haul route information for upcoming projects in order to facilitate a meeting with Gary to get approval for the proposed routes.
- 4. The project progress report has been completed and will be distributed to all of the Commissioners at the January 7th, 1999 Commissioners meeting.
 - This report includes general information on the project including descriptions, construction status, money spent, and color photos (by stage/phase) of completed work.
 Received a letter & sketch from the COE on December 23rd 1998, regarding.
- 5. Received a letter & sketch from the COE on December 23rd, 1998, regarding design of the access road A-frame gates asking for review and comments.
- A letter of response was sent on December 30th, 1998.
 The COE sent a letter to Gary (Arnie Muzumdar) questioning the storm sewer capacity flowing into the detention pond east of Burr St. and north of the river.







CALHOUN STREET

Settlement computations have been performed for the Colfax Street and Calhoun Street roadraises of the Little Calumet River, Indiana, Local Flood Protection and Recreation Project Burr Street Betterment Levee. These computations were performed to determine potential impacts on existing and proposed pipelines and culverts which pass beneath the roadways.

Anticipated settlement within the compressible clayey soils beneath the roadway centerlines at the pipeline and culvert locations ranges from 1 to 2.5 inches (Calhoun and Colfax Street, respectively). Anticipated settlement within the roadways and surficial sandy strata at the pipeline and culvert locations ranges between 2 to 4 inches (Calhoun and Colfax Street respectively). It is anticipated that the majority of the settlement within the sands and roadways will occur during construction. Post construction settlements, within the clayey soils and surficial sands beneath the pipelines and culverts, are summarized helow:

COLFAX STREET	ANTICIPATED CLAYEY SOIL SETTLEMENT (inches)
6" Diameter Oil line	3.0
30" Diameter Gas line	2.5
36" Diameter Gas line	2.5
36" Diameter RCP Culvert	2.0

CALHOUN STREET	ANTICIPATED CLAYEY SOIL SETTLEMENT (inches)
18" CMP Culvert	1.5
6" Diameter Oil line	1.5
·30"Diameter Gas line	1.5
36"Diameter Gas line	1.5
60"Diameter RCP Culvert	1.5

Note that the post construction settlement beneath the proposed new culverts can be reduced by installing the culverts after construction of the roadraises. Reduction of potential settlement will depend on the time delay after the culvert installations.

Please coordinate with the respective utilities and let us know of any impacts on the existing project design.



Thank you for your backcheck comments regarding the East Reach Remediation Project for the Little Calumet River Levee Program. The comments you had were addressed and now are shown on the latest specifications and drawings for the project. Copies (Enclosure 1) are included for your information.

The following information will clarify the issues brought forth in your latest comments of 3 November 1998:

- #3. Landscaping will <u>not</u> be done like the Stage V Phase I project for the residential areas. The "Approved Plan" did not include this provision.
- #116. Our Real Estate person Emmett Clancy confirmed that all the information on the drawings is based on photos taken in 1994. His information shows that structure B is still there. Structures E and F have only the foundations remaining. Judy Vamos' information is probably more current than our photos. There are also livestock buildings there, but they are not scheduled to be demolished.
- #117. The decision waiver to the LCRBDC will be sent when it is received. If the Post Authorization Change (PAC) is not approved, we will have to adjust or change our bid documents according to what was approved.
- #118. "The reworking of the drainage ditches and the interior parkland, as proposed, should have no negative impact on the east reach design." This is quoted from the end of Paragraph 3. in the ED-HH memo of 02 September 1998. It is attached as Enclosure 2.

To answer the 11 August 1998 letter from James Pokrajac, the East Reach Remediation will not impact the new park and the new park will not impact the East Reach Remediation.

With respect to INDOT, a letter was sent to them on 9 November 1998. Jim Pokrajac was copied. Mr. Butts gave verbal approval on 15 December 1998 that his comments are addressed to his satisfaction. His written reply is attached as Enclosure 3.

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- #New. The plans have been revised in the backcheck review to reflect the request by NIPSCO for the access driveway off the south edge of Central Avenue west of the proposed levee. See the attached drawings called Enclosure 1.
- #132. Homes, in general, are to be demolished. Farm buildings of wood (animal shelters) or other low-grade materials are not part of the "approved plan" for demolition.
- #136. The 'possibility' of a settlement cannot be depicted in construction drawings. If the information actually changes, and an addendum is considered during the bidding process, the information may be upgraded.
- #New. a. Notes were added to the sheets C-6 and C-7 to describe the construction of these roads. They will be used during a flood event.
- #New. b. Under separate cover, the real estate drawings for this access road were sent to LCRBDC.
- #167. A guardrail is now shown and will be installed at the gate to prevent going around the ends for entry.
 - #170. A note was added for filling from station D 18+00 to D 19+00.
- #173. Appendix A has been removed. This drawing is based on the latest available data.
 - #195. Swing gates are now changed to the 20-foot width.
- #224. Specification Section 02831 has been revised to reflect the fence at the Gatewell.
- #239. The responses to Comments 118, 273, 274, and 275 still apply. The Invert to one of the three 24" Gates was lowered (drwg S-6) due to an INDOT concern.
- #241. There will be no fill placed between the inlet box and the embankment. The operation/maintenance personnel will be able to access the top of the inlet box by means of the ladder shown on drawing S-5. The access road will have a turnaround. A note is being added to grade and place base material for that area.
- #249. There will be one foot of fill placed over the pipe behind the structure. The operation/maintenance personnel will be able to access the top of the inlet box by means of the ladder shown on drawing S-6. The access road will have a turnaround. A note is being added to grade and place base material for that area.
 - #257. Landscaping is not in the scope of the "Approved Plan".
- #264. The level of ponding at 593.1 NGVD will not impact any residential housing units.
- #272. The borrow site was a carryover from another project. The references about the borrow site have been removed.

- #273. When the culverts stop carrying the floodwaters because they are filled with debris and mud, they will be cleaned. Then they will get loaded again after some time period. We believe we have a practical solution to this ever-present problem by raising the valve inverts.
- #274. This exception to our practical handling of the invert positioning was in response to an INDOT inquiry and review.
- #276. The operation/maintenance personnel will be able to access the top of the inlet box and outlet box by means of the ladders shown on drawings S-5 and S-6.
- #279. This closure information was received from Bollinger and Associates in 1996.
- #280. The Environmental Assessment was performed in accordance with NEPA regulations.
- #283. The CT symbol with a line indicates a cable TV line. It is now shown on drawing G-3.

Please be advised that the above-referenced existing 15-inch storm sewer is still active and serves as a storm drain for the Bethune Elementary School premises and the immediate vicinity. This storm sewer is the sole drainage available for the subject area.

The completion of the levee and access road construction would complicate and adversely affect the draining of the area, if the <u>present and only drainage</u> available with the 15-inch sewer line is abandoned or plugged.

In view of the foregoing, we recommend that the line be preserved; and that the appropriate design requirements for pipe being installed beneath levees be incorporated in the construction plans



We have reviewed your letter of December 28, 1998 concerning the GSD 15-inch storm on the west edge of Marshalltown subdivision. Your letter requests that the pipe be relocated by the GSD outside the levee work limits. While relocation of the sewer completely outside the work limits may be possible, it is not practical or economical. Replacement will involve installing hundreds of feet of new pipe to avoid the work limits of the levee and the levee access road. Considering that the levee and access road is only 1 to 2 feet high at the points where they cross the sewer, we believe that replacing portions of the pipe under the levee and under access road to the levee with new pipe conforming to Corps requirements will be the least costly relocation method. Note also that the upstream end of the storm sewer enters the landside of the levee at very near the point where the levee ties back to high ground.

One alternative to relocating the storm sewer is to shift the levee slightly east between stations 0+00 and 2+00 thereby eliminating the need to make any adjustments to the portion of the pipe which is now under the levee. The only question then would be whether there is a real need to relocate the portion of the sewer under the access road.

We therefore request the Corps consider two alternatives.

- 1. Replace the portions of the storm sewer under the levee and access road with pipe conforming to Corps specifications.
- 2. Shift the levee east between stations 0+00 and 2+00 to avoid the pipe crossing under the levee and replace the pipe, if necessary, under the access road.

Dear Mr. Gardner:

Until about two years ago, we prepared monthly Utility Relocation Status Reports. These Reports were developed at a time when the Corps' architectural/engineering (A/E) firms were doing very little utility coordination. As the project proceeded, the Corps' A/E's started performing more and more utility coordination. Ultimately the Corp's A/E's began to prepare their own utility status reports. For example the Corps' A/E's produced utility status reports for Stage V Phase 2 and Stage V Phase 3. Our Utility Relocation Status Reports were not expanded to include utility data for those projects where the Corps A/E's prepared utility status reports. Therefore as construction was completed for areas covered by our Utility Status Report, our Utility Status Report became obsolete.

The Corps has requested that we resume preparation of our Utility Status Report for some of their new construction projects. This can be done, however we still believe that the most efficient and cost-effective utility relocation coordination is done by the levee designer. We therefore recommend the following action:

- 1. The Corps' A/E's should continue to coordinate utility relocation and produce a utility status report.
- 2. R. W. Armstrong should begin to prepare a summary utility status report which would be updated monthly.



In response to your letter dated December 23rd regarding the detail design for the access road A-frame gates, I have the following comments:

- 1. All joints should be coped.
- 2. Is it necessary to have a 20' gate when the actual width of the roadway is much less?
- 3. We would like all gates in the future installed at a minimum distance from that pavement edge to allow a vehicle to pull off of the pavement, then open the gate. This would prevent the vehicle from having to park on the street while opening the gate.
- 4. We would prefer the gate being able to swing in both directions rather than just 90° inward being that our request (Item #3 of this letter) to move the gate further from the pavement would allow this.

This letter is the Chicago District Corps of Engineers possession regarding the City of Gary's 60" storm sewer pipe that would outfall into the COE retention pond east of Burr Street. The drainage area used in the design of the retention pond is the combined area 8 and 9 as shown on enclosure 1(2.27 square miles). If the drainage boundary of the 60-inch storm sewer pipe does not extend beyond the boundary of areas 8 and 9. Or, at least does not add significantly (say 5 percent or approximately 70 acres) to the total drainage area of 8/9. Then, the sewer design is hydrologically compatible with the retention pond design. We request that before the design is complete a construction document set be furnished to us so that an approval can be given.

- 2. A letter was sent to the COE on December 21st, 1998, enclosing all of the railroad easements for the Norfolk Southern Corporation and the EJ&E, requesting that the COE will confirm that these are accurate due to our legal & appraisal process being started.

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A letter was sent to the COE on December 3rd, 1998, indicating that the culvert easement
under the RR adjacent to Gerry Street does not match with the original COE Real Estate
drawings submitted to us on January, 1994. The appraisal and agreements will be

 - We received a response to this letter from the COE on December 18th, 1998, indicating that these state plane coordinates are correct and match information provided by the COE on their April, 1996 Real Estate drawings, and also easement information.
- 2. At our October 15th Real Estate meeting, the COE indicated Stage VI will be divided into 2 phases.
 - Stage VI P1 (north of the river all construction and south of the river Kennedy to Grace)
 - Stage VI P2 (south of the river Grace to Cline and the north Grace St. pump station)

Burr St. (Betterment) levee - Arbogast to Burr:

 - 1. This acceptance by the City of Gary would relieve the LCRBDC of further discussions for the 179 acre parcel west of Chase St. (Verbally, the city has agreed we are awaiting a copy of the letter).
- B. Crediting
 - 1. We received a letter from the COE dated Sept. 2nd declining our request for credit for almost \$6 million for INDOT related projects for flood control.
 - Dan and Lou will pursue an addition to the LCRBDC legislation that will approve credit for INDOT projects caused by the LCRBDC such as the Grant St. interchange, Indianapolis Blvd. raising of the bridge, and the Georgia Street culverts. (ongoing)



- b. Memorandum, CELRC-PP-PM, 20 March 1998, subject: Little Calumet River, Indiana, Local Flood Control and Recreation, Post Authorization Change Report, May 1997.
- c. Letter, 11 May 1998, from the Little Calumet River Basin Development Commission to Headquarters (enclosure 1) and our 13 November 1998 response (enclosure 2).
- 2. The second endorsement (CECW-PC, 17 November 1997) to reference 1.a. provided Headquarters policy review comments on the subject report. The District's responses to the comments were transmitted via reference 1.b. The Headquarters assessment of the District responses (enclosure 3) was completed on 12 May 1998, but formal guidance was not issued pending resolution of the issue raised by the project sponsor via reference 1.c..
- 3. As documented in enclosure 3, we concur that modification of the project to include construction of 4000 feet of levee and acquisition of 5 residential structures and 2 mobile homes is justified to mitigate for the adverse social effects of induced flooding in the community of Marshalltown and is within the Chief of Engineers discretionary authority. It was also concluded that there is no justification for including flowage easements on 415 acres of agricultural and vacant lands as part of the Federal project, even though the easements are necessary to comply with State of Indiana induced flooding mitigation requirements. In response to the sponsor's request (enclosure 1) that credit be afforded for the value of the flowage easements under the terms of the existing Project Cooperation Agreement (PCA), Headquarters reaffirmed (enclosure 2) that the flowage easements are a non-Federal responsibility for which no credit will be afforded.

- 4. The project modification is approved subject to Headquarters verification of the PAC report revisions required to comply with enclosure 3.

Non-Project Land Management

A. Chase Street to Grant Street land management issues


- 1. Bult brothers have farmed all the land (approx. 200 acres) between the Stage III levees for the 1998 growing season.
 - A letter was sent to the Bult Brothers on December 3rd, 1998, indicating that this land will not be farmable for the 1999 season.
- 2. We have been coordinating with the COE to provide a drainage plan for this area that will be no worse than it was before they built the levee. The COE cut large number of field tiles.
 - A letter was written to the COE on July 22nd, 1998, questioning their design for interior drainage (Refer to Engineering Report) We have still not received a response as of the date of this report.

B. WHITECO

- 1. The sign agreement release and receipt and license for sign locations have been completed and a check was sent to WHITECO in the amount of \$124,825.
 - This will now generate \$6,600/year to the Commission for the (2) new signs on the south side of I-80/94 between Chase and Grant.
 - Sign #2316 was increased from \$400/year to \$600/year.

C. South of 35th, east of Chase (Commission land)

- 1. We own approx. 100 acres of land south of 35th Ave., east of Chase. Stan Stann (tower man) occupies approx. 4 acres. (approx. 45 acres are farmable)
- 2. A letter was sent to Jerry Ewen on December 4th, 1998, requesting an agreement allowing him to plow the land in exchange for free farming for one year (this is approx. 45 acres of land).
 - A motion was made at our December 9th, 1998 Commissioners meeting to advertise to farm this land.
- D. We received a copy of a letter from Attorney Reising to Fluid Pump Service regarding the installation of pumps at Gleason Park they are currently not installed.
- E. We received a letter from Stan Stann on August 18th, 1998, regarding considerations for Ameritech to add facilities onto their existing tower at 35th and Chase.
 - 1. Received a letter from Stan Stann on December 18th, 1998, indicating he will send us a check in the amount of \$2,750 for back payment by Ameritech after receipt of addendum #1 to the license agreement.
 - 2. Received a letter from Attorney Casale to Stan Stann requesting signatures for license agreement.



- 3. Construction started for the expansion on December 26th, 1998 and should be completed by January 15th, 1999.
- F. We had a farm land lease agreement with the N.W. IN Foodbank for the 1998 farming season allowing them to farm 50 acres of our land for a total rental payment of \$1.
 - 1. It was brought to our attention that Don Ewen farmed this area and planted a soybean crop. It was also brought to our attention that Mr. Ewen harvested this crop and did not submit any proceeds to the Foodbank (He contended that the profits covered his time and material).
 - 2. A discussion was held at the November 5th, 1998 Commission meeting to not allow the usage of our land for farming unless a written agreement was in place assuring money from the COE all goes to the Foodbank.
 - We have scheduled a discussion at our January 7th, 1999 Commissioners meeting to see if we want to advertise this land with the 45 acres south of 35th Ave.
- G. We have contacted Gary Dunlap and Dale Nimetz (current farmers on Commission land) and allowed them a one year extension based upon an option in their current lease agreements.
 - 1. A letter will be written to both farmers this summer indicating that both properties will be advertised for the year 2000 planting season.

Project Related Land Management

- A. O&M (Project manual review/accepting completed segments)
 - 1. The COE has requested since August 28, 1997 that we complete our project manual review and then start to accept completed levee segments (distributed condensed O&M Manual) (ongoing)
 - 2. We received a letter from the COE on November 4th, 1998, requesting our final comments to the O&M as soon as possible.
 - A meeting was held on December 8th, 1998, with Gardner/Flora/Pokrajac to present an overview to the commissioners.
 - 3. The November 4th, 1998 letter also requested that we clean out the (2) trenches for closures on Chase St. and at 35th St.
 - They requested that we get the City of Gary to do this. (Gary Sanitary District) We also got a quote from a contractor to do this work in the amount of \$2,525.
 - A letter was sent to the GSD on December 17th, 1998, requesting their help in cleaning out these trenches, and asking if any charges would be incurred to the LCRBDC.
 - We received a letter from the GSD on December 21st, 1998, acknowledging our request and stating that they were in the review process.
- B. Gary Sanitary District pump agreements
 - 1. Received a letter from the Gary Sanitary District on November 17th, 1998, which included a list of issues regarding engineering, construction, and legal issues in reference to getting agreements into place for the four (4) East Reach pump stations. These four stations are as follows:
 - <u>Ironwood stormwater pumping station</u> (Stage II-4)

- Broadway stormwater pumping station (Stage II-3B)
- Grant St. stormwater pumping station (Stage II-3C-2)
- North Burr St. stormwater pumping station (Stage IV-2A)
- 2. Refer to each stage/phase of these stations for current status in the Engineering Report.
- 3. An emergency response meeting was held in Crown Point on December 15th, 1998, to review Y2K computer impacts, as presented by the USGS. In addition, we reviewed with GSD and the COE what would be required to use GSD as the base station for the City of Gary.
 - We sent a letter to GSD along with enclosures of the O&M manual, emergency response information, and estimated annual operations and maintenance costs as prepared by the COE.

C. WLTH Radio Tower (north of I-80/94, east of Martin Luther King Drive)

- 1. The survey work for this tower was completed and submitted to the COE for reevaluation on August 28th.
 - We are awaiting a written response from the COE as to whether or not this area will be included in the east reach remediation area flowage. (ongoing)
 - This letter should waive the appraisal and approve the WLTH engineering solutions to remedy the flood problem and allow these changes to be a creditable project cost.

D. Mitigation (entire project area)

- 1. LCRBDC still has concerns about the official COE mitigation plan which does not explain the exact procedure for acquisition in the Hobart Marsh area. (Ongoing)
- 2. We received a letter from the COE on October 14th indicating only that this area was not included in their current mitigation plan, and that they cannot give written confirmation until coordination is completed with the COE, IDNR, IDEM & U.S. Fish & Wildlife.
- E. We **held** an emergency management coordination meeting at Crown Point on December 15th, 1998. Part of this meeting **was** directed to the City of Gary and how we may use the newly reorganized GD/SD to help with the emergency response.
 - 1. We forwarded the O&M Manual, projected costs for annual maintenance and operation, and the emergency response manual to the GSD on December 16th for their information, review, and comments.

At our meeting of December 15th, we briefly discussed the possibility of the Gary Sanitary District cleaning out existing concrete trenches that will be used for closure structures as part of our emergency response plan during a major flood event. The location of these trenches are on 35th Avenue just east of Chase Street, and on Chase Street approximately ½ mile north of 35th.

You mentioned that you might be able to coordinate using one of your vacuum trucks to remove existing water and silt from these trenches. We anticipate that a 3-man crew would be needed (one supervisor, one operator, and one serviceman) in addition to one vacuum truck for one (1) 8 hour weekday total. This would also include the transportation and disposal of this non-hazardous material. Would you please submit to me in writing whether you can do this work or not, as part of our cooperation for the flood control project; or if charges would be incurred.
